PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to a review of the 2013 season.

In order to have successful competitions the SJRU needs great administrators! On behalf of the Sydney Junior Rugby Union (SJRU) community I would like to thank Kerry Brady, the SJRU Competitions Manager, and Matt Kellahan, the SJRU Competition Administrator, for their fantastic efforts during the season. They have both done a magnificent job in managing and administering the SJRU competitions.

Kerry should be further congratulated on being awarded the prestigious Nick Farr-Jones Spirit of Rugby Award at the 2013 John Eales' Medal Ceremony. The prestigious award is given to an individual who best upholds the ethos and spirit of rugby on or off the field and who has best emulated rugby's values of passion, integrity, discipline, respect, teamwork in the past 12 months.

During the season Taleah Neowhouse resigned as the SJRU Competitions Manager and on behalf of the rugby community I would like to thank her for her tireless efforts over the last three years and wish her all the very best as she peruses a career in sporting administration. Taleah should be very proud of her achievement this year of introducing rugby to children with Special Needs.

In 2013 player numbers decreased however we continue to see new Junior Clubs join the SJRU competitions. In 2014 we will welcome Penrith RSL Kookaburras and Briars.

From a financial perspective the SJRU has had another successful year and as a result we have funds available to invest in the development of Junior Rugby in the Sydney metropolitan area. The challenge for the SJRU Committee will be how best to invest these funds.

In 2012 the SJRU paid the cost of referees while NSW Rugby paid the cost of the SJRU Administrators. In 2013 this funding model was revamped to bring it more into line with model adopted by NSW Subbies. As a result the SJRU will now pay the major portion of the cost of the SJRU Administrators while NSW Rugby will be responsible for the cost of referees. From an SJRU perspective this is a great improvement as we now have control over our own destiny through the SJRU Administrators who are integral to the SJRU providing successful competitions.

In 2013 the SJRU Committee trialled the provision of first aid personnel at matches. The first aid trial got off to a rocky start. However after tweaking the model during the middle of the season I believe that it was a raging success during the latter competition rounds and finals series. As a result the 2013 SJRU Committee recommends that in 2014 it will be compulsory for qualified first aid personnel to be present at all SJRU Competition matches.

The introduction by the SJRU over the last two years of "Expectations of Behaviour" signs and vests for Ground

Marshall and Trainers as well as the implementation of "Respect Rugby" in 2014 by NSW Rugby has seen an improvement in the behaviour of both players and spectators. As a result the number of players that were required to be sanctioned by the SJRU Judiciary in 2013 has reduced. Further improvements can still be made and so in 2014 the SJRU will continue to work towards ensuring that exemplary behaviour is displayed by the players and spectators.

I would like to thank the SJRU Judiciary which was ably led by Mark Ashhurst as Judiciary Chairman and Dougal Geddes as Citing Officer. In 2012 the SJRU increased the number of Judiciary Committee members and in 2013 we introduced a roster for the Judiciary Committee members as well as ensuring that a senior Judiciary member chaired every hearing. As a consequence we have increased the number and depth of our Judiciary Committee and as a result we have a broad cross section of members who are very capable of dealing with the many and varied offences that they are presented with.

The SJRU has had another very successful representative rugby season.

For the second year running Sydney Juniors had a clean sweep against NSW Country Juniors winning the Under 14, Under 15, Under 16 and Under 17 matches. The Under 16's participated in the Under 16 National Carnival and finished third after losing in the pool round matches to the eventual winners.

It is greatly disappointing that NSW Country Juniors continues to forego participating in the NSW Junior Regionals. The NSW Junior Regionals gives the elite players the opportunity to showcase their talents against other elite rugby players of their own age.

In 2013 the Australian Rugby Union (ARU) has introduced the Junior Gold Cup for Under 15's and Under 17's. This is a new exciting concept as it now gives the players selected the opportunity to participate in a five (5) week tournament after their three months of training over summer. In 2014 the SJRU Committee will continue to work with the ARU, NSWJR, NSWCR and the other Junior Rugby stakeholders to better integrate the junior representative rugby program.

The Under 10 to Under 12 age groups remain strong in the Friday Night Competitions and the Saturday Competitions. However the number of teams wishing to participate in the older age groups on a Saturday continues to diminish. However the SJRU will continue to offer Saturday rugby for those players that wish to participate.

The Sunday Competition was strong in all age groups in 2013. The biggest issue in the Sunday Competition is the grading of teams in the A Competition. In the A Competition there are often a small number of very strong teams and so is it better to run a small 6 team competition or an expanded 10, 12 or 14 team competition? In 2013 the SJRU Committee conducted A Competitions with 10, 12 or 14 teams.

The benefit of the expanded competitions is that teams only have to play the strong teams once during the season while on the other hand the teams at the bottom of the Competition have a tough season. In 2014 the SJRU Committee will continue to look at options of running viable and competitive A Competitions on a Sunday.

Another initiative introduced by the SJRU this year was the "End of Season" survey of parents and players. The results of the survey were very enlightening and were presented to an All Clubs meeting in September 2013. I would like to thank Ilkka Tales for all his work in conducting the survey and analysing the results.

I would like to thank the three District Referee Associations for all their hard work and dedication in providing, coaching and developing referees for Junior Rugby because without the referees we would not have a game of rugby. There was an improvement in the referee appointments system in 2013 but there is still a few glitches that will have to ironed out for 2014.

In 2013 we revamped our Committee structure. We expanded the Executive and created a subcommittee for the Age Coordinators. In 2014 we wish to continue with the Age Coordinators Subcommittee as well as introducing a Representative Rugby Subcommittee and a Development Subcommittee. The reason for setting up Subcommittees is to encourage a greater participation of Junior Clubs in the SJRU but at the same time reducing the burden of having to also attend every Committee meeting. It is envisaged that in 2014 the SJRU Subcommittees will meet before the SJRU Committee meeting and the members of the Subcommittees will be more than welcome to attend the subsequent SJRU Committee Meeting.

On behalf of the SJRU Committee I would like to thank all the coaches, managers, Club officials and Match officials for all your tireless work during the season. Without your dedication to the sport of Junior Rugby the players would never have the opportunity to play "the game they play in heaven".

To all the parents and guardians I would like to thank you for all your efforts during the season whether it has been manning the BBQ or canteen, giving encouragement to your son or daughter or assisting the team as the Assistant Referee, trainer or Ground Marshall. You all play an important part in the enjoyment of the game by the players.

The SJRU Committee has continued to foster the relationship between the SJRU and NSW Rugby. Many of the tasks that were previously performed by volunteers are now being very ably completed by the SJRU Administrators. I would like to thank Nick Farr-Jones (Chairman of NSW Rugby), Bruce Worboys (Executive Rugby NSW Rugby) and Mark Green (General Manager - Administration & Competitions, NSW Rugby) for all their fantastic support in 2013.

Mike Doyle, Adam Crane and the three ARU Development teams have continued their great work in promoting Junior Rugby at the schools and local Clubs. I know their work is greatly appreciated by all the coaches at the Junior Clubs.

Michael Cheika and the Waratahs have made a concerted effort this year to reengage with grassroots rugby which will hopefully result in greater crowd numbers at the Waratah home matches in 2014. This reengagement meant that approximately 50% of the players and parents who responded to the SJRU survey this year said that they had met a Waratah during the season. The SJRU Junior Clubs responded by having a strong showing at the Juniors March Past held before the Waratahs v Reds match at ANZ Stadium in July.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank each and every member of the SJRU Committee who has spent endless hours during the season in assisting Kerry, Matt and Taleah in administering and managing the Competitions where we have more than 200 Matches being played each weekend. Their support of Junior Rugby, the administrators and each other has been unwavering and from my perspective absolutely fantastic.

One of the SJRU Committee members who are retiring this year is Geoff Ferris. Geoff has been a driving force in the success of Junior Rugby at Dural, Eastwood, Western Zone and SJRU for more than 10 years. Geoff has never been afraid to get in and get the job done and he should be extremely proud of his achievements. I sincerely hope that he will continue to be involved in rugby because volunteers with the passion and enthusiasm of Geoff are extremely rare.

On behalf of the SJRU Committee I would also like to thank Andrew Moore, Gary Paton, Ilkka Tales, David Grayling, as well as a number of Age Coordinators, who are stepping down at the Annual General Meeting. I would like to thank each and every one of them for the time that they have invested in Junior Rugby and in particular the SJRU.

Finally enjoy the off season and we look forward to welcoming you back for the 2014 season.

COMPETITION REPORT

2014 has been a year of great challenges and changes. The departure of Taleah Neowhouse created a large void as her attention to detail and passion for the game of Rugby was evident to all. The mammoth task of creating a draw for over 370 teams from the ages of 10 to Opens cannot be underestimated and Taleah accomplished this task with a minimum of fuss and assistance. To ensure that over 7,500 players could commence their competition on time with a relatively smooth transition from the previous year is a testament to her abilities.

Once again challenges for Junior Rugby have come from all directions and the present parlous financial situation of the ARU impacts heavily on all levels of Rugby.

One of the major concerns in both 2012 and 2013 has revolved around the competition management system – Buddha. For many years SJRU has been told that a new revamped MRA, together with new Club websites would be developed. However at the present time this appears a long way off. The incoming Committee will be continuing the investigation regarding a competition management system. The importance of this to both SJRU and its Clubs cannot be too highly stressed.

The 2013 seasons' major concern of the competition was in relation to regrading. No issue during the year produced more angst, misunderstanding and concern than this. For those unfamiliar with the process please be reassured that regrading is a serious issue and the Committee, Age Coordinators and regrading committee spend an inordinate amount of time investigating all concerns and suggestions. One of the factors that impacted heavily on the process this year was the drop in both player and team numbers. This is of major concern in the older age groups where it was apparent that there was a huge discrepancy of ability between a small numbers of teams. Running a competition only for 3 or 4 teams is problematic and the decision to increase the size of the competition in some age groups was not taken lightly. It is hoped that similar constraints will not occur in 2014. Meanwhile all those with constructive suggestions for any improvements are invited to submit them for consideration.

As mentioned above, a major concern for all involved in Junior Rugby is the drop, both in registrations and team numbers. The Committee, led by Ilkka Tales, surveyed both all Club contacts as well as players in two separate surveys. The results were presented at the All Clubs meeting in September. Unfortunately there is no easy fix to the drop in numbers but attention to many of the issues raised should assist in the formulation of strategies to address the problem.

On a positive note, the increased cooperation between SJRU, NSWRU and the Waratahs has ensured the link between Junior Rugby and the Waratahs has been strengthened. The Waratahs Club blitz was very well received by all and this will occur again in 2014. Free tickets for those under 12, the creation of a special "Future Tahs" website and increased electronic communication have all enhanced this important relationship. All players under the age of 12 are urged to register for their free season pass by visiting www.futuretahs.com.au. This increased cooperation is thanks to Michael Cheika and all of the Waratahs staff.

The contribution of the ARU Community staff to Junior Rugby should also be acknowledged. With the advent of the ARU staff relocating to the NSWRU/SJRU offices, communication between is much easier and more direct. The various Development officers have been very proactive contacting local Clubs and offering assistance in many ways. They are available to assist and advise and should be contacted with any concerns.

Judicial issues this year showed a further improvement from 2012 and it is acknowledged that this is due to better communication between Clubs, Coaches/Managers and their players. Clubs in the main have been very proactive at stemming abuse, violence and general offences. The Judiciary, Competition Manager and Administrator are very grateful as it means fewer Wednesday evenings spent at hearings! Appreciation must go to Mark Ashurst and Dougal Geddes, long time members of our Judicial panel and to Cameron Player, Andrew Hourigan, Steve Hardy, David Yole and Nick Garling who all gave their time willingly to advise, attend and assist with all judicial matters.

Effective communication between all participants is probably one of the most challenging aspects of Rugby at all levels. Many issues that arise can often be resolved by Presidents talking to other Presidents or coaches liaising with their opposition. In some instances this year, some issues that in the past may have resulted in a referral to the Citing Commissioner have been resolved by the 2 respective Club Presidents speaking to each other. Communication avenues must be enhanced and utilised further between all participants.

The introduction of team Ground Marshalls, clearly identified in high vis bibs has been a success in most instances and will be mandated again in 2014. We still need further education at the Club level of the GM responsibilities and encouragement for all teams to supply one and abide by the rules regarding acceptable behaviour.

In conjunction with the GM bibs the Expectation of Behaviour signs distributed to all Clubs have been very well received and there should be no ground hosting Junior games without a sign prominently displayed. It is of extreme importance that all Clubs be supportive of all attempts to stamp out unacceptable behaviour from all participants so as to make the game safer and more enjoyable for everyone.

The Junior March Past, which is so well supported each year, will be held in 2014 prior to the Waratahs Vs Brumbies game at ANZ Stadium on June 28th. This year we had over 6,000 marchers and supporters in attendance and for 2014 we are aiming for 7,000!! Book the date now and start getting the teams organised!!

2013 saw the introduction of a First Aid trial for home games for a selected group of Clubs. After an initial rocky start with another supplier the SJRU has now entered into an agreement with Narelle Veverka of Orthosports to supply first aid attendants regularly. Orthosports covered the first aid requirements for almost all Clubs hosting Finals as well as the regular Club games for the selected Clubs. The supply of competent first aid is of concern to all parents and SJRU...in 2014 it should be a requirement for first aid to be in attendance at all games. SJRU will however facilitate the supply, organisation and accreditation of first aid so that the administrative burden on Clubs is not increased.

Sydney Junior representative teams took part in Regionals and City Country day with the U16s competing at the ARU Nationals in October. All teams wore the Sydney colours proudly and were a credit to the Union. To all coaches and management staff a vote of thanks for your efforts and for your attention to detail.

The second season of the centralised appointments system for referees has concluded and it is apparent that we need to still look at ways of improving the structure. It is unfortunate but often last minute changes to games are required and this rescheduling can cause issues with appointments. This is something we need to refine for next year. Thanks must go to Scott Rogan and Ron Mancell for the time and effort expended on the appointments system.

The SJRU Grand Final weekend of 30th August/1st September saw 50 Grand Finals played at various venues across Sydney. The use of the 3 fields at St Luke's, Concord enabled 19 A and B grade games of the older age groups to be held at the one venue. The weather for the Grand Finals was very kind and the attendances at all venues were extremely high.

Thanks must go to all Hosting Clubs for the tremendous efforts they made to make the day such a success. Appreciation also to the Waratahs players who were able to attend and to Tahman who appeared at the U10s Grand Finals at Wahroonga!

Spartan and Mazda are both still on board as sponsors and the supply of Rugby balls will be distributed early in the year to all affiliated Clubs. This sponsorship is a great saving for Clubs and for Sydney Juniors and we are appreciative of both Mazda and Spartan for all they contribute. It is hoped that Clubs consider Spartan when purchasing equipment etc as they are extremely keen to assist Junior Rugby Clubs.

A competition as large and diverse as Sydney Juniors does not happen easily and the cooperation and hard work by the Committee is instrumental in enabling the thousands of players to take the field each weekend in a safe, competitive environment. To the Committee, Vice Presidents and Age Coordinators: Geoff Ferris, Gary Paton, Andrew Moore, Ilkka Tales, Rory Macleod, Ben Gregory, Bonnie West, Gai Mann, David Grayling and David Radford my sincere thanks for your help and advice as well as your encouragement. To Tony Fisher my sincere thanks for his support, advice and encouragement. Tony's energy and commitment is second to none and he ensures that Sydney Juniors runs on an even keel and is transparent and procedural in all its dealings.

My first season has been made much easier and less daunting due to the tremendous support and hard work of Matt Kellahan. Matt is always ready to assist Clubs and never fails to answer any queries or problems when asked. He is the resident expert with all things "Buddha" and is often engaged via phone and email assisting Club registrars with any issues. Next year it is planned that Matt will play an increasing role in communicating with Clubs and organising facets of the competition.

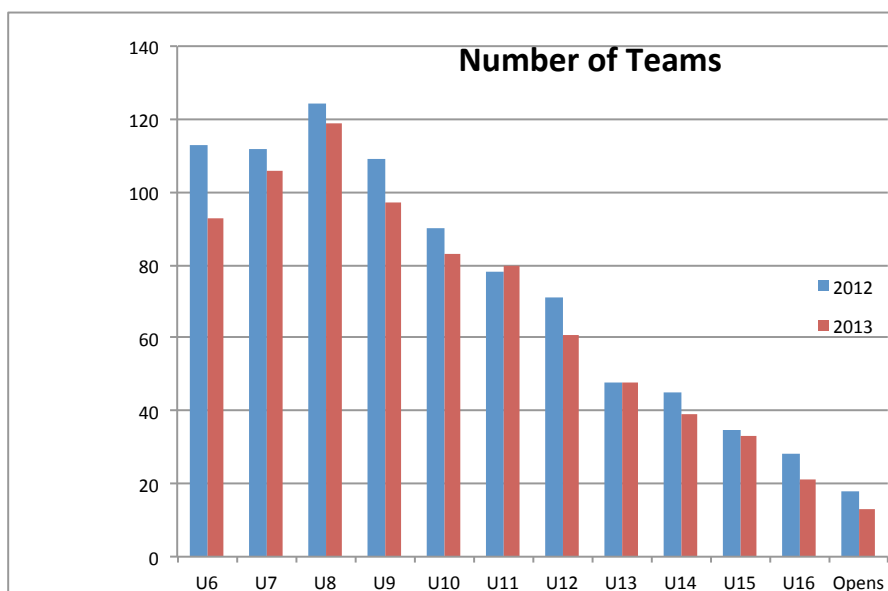

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

As I pointed out last year whilst there is an appointed VP development, SJRU as a committee are continuously developing rugby. Every committee meeting involves a dozen or more officials from all areas of Sydney contributing to each issue. The majority of issues involve an outcome which develops rugby in the SJRU area. I would take this opportunity to thank the SJRU committee and in particular Tony Fisher for their roles in SJRU development.

In 2013 two new clubs St Patricks Old Boys and Allambie Heights were formed and participated successfully in SJRU. In 2014 we have several new clubs seeking admittance into SJRU. Most are starting with minis and will build from this base. It is the best way to proceed and hopefully will lead to bigger and better SJRU clubs in the future. We also look forward to this trend continuing.

SJRU development fund has been utilised in helping several clubs fund smaller projects in 2013. It was also used to buy the Behaviour signs that were prominent in 2013 at all club grounds. An application form is available on the SJRU website for those clubs wishing to look at the criteria for which monies are approved for assisting clubs.

First Aid has been a priority for SJRU in 2013 and the implementation of plans and procedures has led to a vast improvement in actions at games. This is a big step in developing the confidence in both clubs and parents towards the safety of junior rugby and all those involved should be commended.

During the latter part of the season a survey was conducted to assist with feedback and was widely circulated to Districts and clubs. It is hoped that the information received which was discussed at the All Clubs meeting will aid SJRU with its ongoing development plans. I would like to thank Illka Tales for the time and effort he spent in organising and tabulating this survey.

Developing rugby and in particular the playing of games is heavily dependent on our referees. We all need to assist in recruitment to continue their and our games development. We also need to do everything possible to assist in achieving appropriate behaviour and attitudes towards our volunteer referees.

7's rugby is on all rugby bodies agendas to develop. The ARU are heavily promoting the 7's game in schools for both boys and girls. We will work with the ARU to develop the best way in which to utilise this format and introduce it to as many junior players as possible. Many clubs are developing 7's gala days as a way of attracting new players and giving current players a chance to play this form of the game.

Developing the Representative rugby pathway is also an issue that has been addressed in 2013. After much consultation the new Junior Gold Cup Program was initiated for 2014 and will hopefully offer many rugby juniors opportunities. The ARU team continue to work with Districts and Clubs in all aspects of development and improvement and I would thank them all for their efforts. There are well accepted and appreciated programs and events held in 2013 being prepared for 2014 along with several new ideas.

NSWJRU introduced several new formats in 2013 for the continued development of both the NSW Championships and the Representative Rugby pathway. The State Championships were well received by all age groups. The quarter final format was particularly well received and gave many more districts further opportunities and game time. Illawarra in the U13's who were not seeded in the top four came from the quarters to deservedly win the Championship. More emphasis on more game time and participation is the goal. Wider participation from country areas to put City and country together is also a priority. I would also thank Kerry Brady who through her many duties contribute towards the development of kid's rugby. Kerry is instrumental in overseeing and instigating many of the strategies put into place by SJRU as well as the above NSWJRU initiatives.

In 2013 the issue of development and or lack of it in the West and South of Sydney was an issue we have sought to address. I have been in regular contact with the officials from in particular the Parramatta District as we attempt to implement plans that will actually make a difference. We have recognised that the West is a priority and that we need the ARU to focus as much assistance as possible into these areas. We are currently working on some initiatives that will assist in recruitment of players and in particular the assistance of administrative help for clubs. It is critical that rugby parents from these areas get involved to assist if we are to achieve positive results.

I will not be standing for SJRU VP Development as I fervently wish for a rugby person from the South or in particular the West to take on the role and be able to give it the time and input required in genuinely utilising all the avenues available to make a real difference. This cannot be done by someone from outside these areas. For the West and South of Sydney to develop and fight for funding and assistance at all levels it requires a person or persons with close ties and knowledge of the area to stand up and take on the challenge. I believe this person working with the SJRU committee could make a real difference.

The SJRU Representative programme continues to be a highlight of the SJRU programme. The 2013 year was one of transition building on the solid base that had been built and developing the programme so that more boys had exposure to the representative scene.

It was once said "If you are standing still, you are also going backwards." The 2013 season was approached with this in mind, not making change for changes sake but making change to provide the players with the best opportunity to prove they are worthy wearers of an SJRU jersey.

Previously the SJRU Under 14 side to paly country was the highest placed Sydney side at the State Championships. This year we decided that if the side was to represent the SJRU it should be a selected side. From the State Championships held in Orange a squad of 33 was selected for a 5 week programme, which included training sessions, exposure to the ARU High Performance Unit and a trial game. The squad was reduced to 23 after 3 weeks but at this critical entry point into the ARU Gold programme we saw great benefit in giving players the exposure to high level representative football and to Hugh Carpenter and the ARU team. We were lucky enough that both Hugh and James Grant were able to act as selectors in Orange, providing further exposure to the young men.

In the Under 17's we controversially reintroduced a Possibles and Probables fixture after the State Championships to select the SJRU Under 17's. Under 17's is a tough year as many boys choose to concentrate on School football and do not involve themselves in the District Sides. There are good players that are hidden in weaker sides so in an attempt to give all players equal chance of representing a squad of 36 was selected to play in this fixture at the Regional Weekend. The SJRU side was announced in conjunction with the SJRU Under 15's and Under 16's.

SJRU Coaches, Mangers and Selectors

The SJRU Coaches, Managers and Selectors were appointed through an interview process by 3 members of the SJRU Committee and a NSWJRU Committee Member. The SJRU VP Representative was involved in this process.

Due to the transition of the role the appointments were not made until February 2013. In 2014 applicants have been sought and to date the response has been very pleasing.

Zone Coaches, Mangers and Selectors

The Lions tour provided certain challenges this year in that the Regional Carnival was being held on the same weekend that the Wallabies played the Lions in Melbourne. This reduced the depth of applicants for these roles. However, it did enable some new faces to be blooded in coaching at this level. The Sydney coaches were appointed as Chairman of selectors for Zone sides.

The selection of coaching teams was done in conjunction with the relevant Zone officials.

This year the Regional Carnival was only attended by the Sydney based Zones. This being the case we introduced a Barbarian side for the Under 15's.

Australian Under 16 Championships

It would be remiss of me to not mention the fantastic effort of the SJRU Under 16 side at the National Championships. They finished third in the tournament having lost to the eventual winners, Queensland Red by 5 points. This was a game that could have gone either way and arguably we were the second best team in the competition as Queensland Red had beaten other sides by large amounts.

Final Thoughts

It has been a successful year but we cannot rest on the past. Our relationship with the ARU Gold programme continues to develop and they are supportive of club rugby. The challenge of attracting coaches and managers for our Representative Teams remains an issue. We need to continually replenish our stocks, encourage young and up and coming coaches and provide opportunities to those who have been loyal to the programme.

We are lucky to have people like Tony Fisher, Geoff Ferris and Kerry Brady involved in the leadership of our game and there is a myriad of hard working committee members who without recognition work tirelessly to make sure that boys and girls can play rugby. To all of you thank you.
