PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Sydney Junior Rugby Union (SJRU) has completed another successful season of Junior Club rugby.

The SJRU has two fantastic administrators in our SJRU Competitions Manager Kerry Brady and our SJRU Competition Administrator Matt Kellahan. Both administrators put in countless hours during the rugby season so that we have a well-managed competition. On behalf of the SJRU rugby community I would like to thank Kerry and Matt for their sterling efforts during 2014. It is also pleasing to report that during the season we finalised Kerry's employment contract as the SJRU Competitions Manager.

It was great to see the release of the Match Day Manual in 2014. This was a great new initiative from Kerry. During the year the SJRU Committee upgraded the computers for the SJRU Administrators and they are now using the most up to date technology. In 2014 the SJRU continued to support Trytons Rugby which is conducted at a number of centres across the Sydney metropolitan area during winter. Trytons Rugby introduces rugby to children with Special Needs.

The player numbers in the younger age groups remain strong but we continue to have concerns with player numbers in the older age groups. In 2014 we conducted a Saturday 7's program for those older players who wished to play rugby on a Saturday. The program was moderately successful but in 2015 we have to work closer with the NSW Development team to encourage Public Schools to enter teams in the Saturday 7's competitions. The SJRU is also working with the Premiership Clubs to set up an Under 18's Competition as part of their Colts program in 2015. If this initiative is successful then the SJRU will continue to offer an Opens competition in 2015.

The Friday Night Competition remains strong in the Under 10 to Under 12 age groups and the Sunday Competition is strong across all age groups except possibly Opens. The introduction of new SJRU Competition Rules has seen the reduction in the number of Super teams being formed and the SJRU Committee will continue to formulate plans so that we have the most viable and competitive structures for the A competitions.

From a financial perspective the SJRU has had another successful year and as a result we have funds available to invest in the development of Junior Rugby in the Sydney metropolitan area. The challenge for the SJRU Committee, Districts and Clubs will be how best to invest these funds.

In 2013 the SJRU revamped its funding model with NSW Rugby whereby the SJRU pays the major portion of the cost of the SJRU Administrators while NSW Rugby is responsible for the cost of referees. From the SJRU's perspective we continue to realise the benefits of this change as we now spend more time managing Junior rugby and virtually no time in managing the demands of the refereeing fraternity. However the financial challenge for all Clubs in 2015 is that the Australian Rugby Union (ARU) has recently announced a Player Participation Levy of \$11.00 for Under 6's and Under 7's and \$27.50 for Under 8's to Under 18's. It is greatly disappointing that this levy has

been introduced without any consultation with the SJRU from either the ARU or NSW Rugby.

In 2013 Ortho Sport was contracted by the SJRU to provide first aid at all home matches of Clubs who signed up to this new program. This initiative is growing from strength to strength and in 2014 we had 22 Clubs who were utilising Ortho Sport's services. Ortho Sport also provided first aid personnel at Final Series matches and representative fixtures. The SJRU Committee believes that it is essential that Clubs provide first aid at all home matches so that parents are comforted that there is an experienced first aid person on hand if there child happens to be injured during a match. In 2015 the SJRU will be enforcing the requirement that qualified first aid personnel are present at all SJRU Competition matches.

Following the introduction of "Expectations of Behaviour" signs and vests for Ground Marshall and Trainers as well as the implementation of "Respect Rugby" we have seen an improvement in the behaviour of both players and spectators. However we have a number of rogue coaches in our ranks whose behaviour continues to sully the name of Junior rugby. These coaches have a win at all costs attitude and do not ensure that all players in their team get maximum enjoyment from the "game that they play in heaven". As a result the SJRU Committee are currently working with NSW Rugby to develop a course for coaches on the management of players and parents as well as ensuring that every player in the team gets an equal opportunity to develop their rugby skills.

In 2014 the SJRU Judiciary Committee was again ably led by Mark Ashhurst as Judiciary Chairman and Dougal Geddes as Citing Officer. The SJRU Judiciary Committee that the SJRU Committee has assembled has gone from strength to strength and is doing a fantastic job in managing the many and varied offences that are committed by a very small number of players and team officials. The effect the Judiciary has had on managing inappropriate behaviour is exemplified by the fact that very few, if any, players or team officials who are found guilty by the Judiciary reoffend and then have to reappear again. As we have increased the number and depth of the SJRU Judiciary Committee we have decided that from 2014 the members of the SJRU Appeals Committee will be drawn from the SJRU Judiciary Committee.

Over the last few years we have been having discussions with NSW Country Juniors (NSWCJRU) about increased participation at the NSW State Championships and the NSW Junior Regionals. The SJRU and NSWCJRU have agreed to incorporate the NSW Country Championships into the NSW State Championships where the SJRU Districts will contest the Metropolitan Championships while NSWCJRU will contest the Country Championships and then there will be a cross over between both groups to determine the NSW State Champions in each age group from Under 12's to Under 17's. In addition NSWCJRU will enter two teams in the NSW Junior Regionals which gives the elite players the opportunity to showcase their talents against other elite rugby players of their own age.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The SJRU has had another very successful representative rugby season. Sydney Juniors defeated NSW Country Juniors in the Under 14's, Under 15's and Under 18's, drew with CJRU in the Under 16's and lost the Under 17s.

The ARU cancelled the Under 16 National Carnival this year and so NSW Rugby conducted a very successful Under 16 invitational carnival with teams from SJRU, NSWJCJR, NSW Schools and a Western Development team.

The Australian Rugby Union (ARU) completed the first season of the Junior Gold Cup for Under 15's and Under 17's at the beginning of 2014. The Junior Gold Cup was a very successful tournament and will again be running during the 2014 / 2015 off season.

On 27 October 2014 the new SJRU Constitution was adopted by the SJRU Committee and Districts. The new Constitution was registered by NSW Fair Trading on 5 November 2014. The main changes resulting from the new Constitution are:-

- Constitution is based on the model Constitution promulgated by NSW Sport and Recreation;
- Committee members serve a two (2) year term;
- Board comprises a minimum of (4) Directors and a maximum of fifteen (15) Directors who are elected;
- Board includes a maximum of five (5) Appointed Directors who are nominated by the Board;
- Adopts most of the recommendations of the Garling review;
- corrects some of the anomalies in the current Constitution;
- All Clubs and Districts receive one (1) vote at a SJRU General Meeting;
- Committee members don't vote at SJRU General Meetings;
- Changes the year end of the SJRU to 31 August;
- Encourages all Clubs and Districts to be incorporated;

Congratulations to Chris Hicks from Western Raptors and Penrith District who was awarded the HSBC Volunteer of the Year for his contribution and commitment to rugby within his community at the recent John Eales Medal presentation.

The three District Referee Associations provide referees for all SJRU Competition matches and I would like to thank them for all the work that they do in coaching and developing referees for Junior Rugby because without the referees we would not have a game of rugby. There are still a few glitches in the referee appointments system that the referees will have to iron out in 2015.

On behalf of the SJRU Committee I would like to thank all the coaches, managers, Club officials and Match officials for all your tireless work during the season. Without your dedication to the sport of Junior Rugby the players would never have the opportunity to play "the game they play in heaven".

To all the parents and guardians I would like to thank you for all your efforts during the season whether it has been manning the BBQ or canteen, giving encouragement to

your son or daughter or assisting the team as the Assistant Referee, trainer or Ground Marshall. You all play an important part in the enjoyment of the game by the players.

Congratulations to Geoff Ferris on his appointment as the Youth Director on the Board of NSW Rugby. Geoff has always been available to provide advice to the SJRU Committee as well as champion the issues of the SJRU at the board of NSW Rugby.

A special thank you to Mark Green (General Manager - Administration & Competitions, NSW Rugby) who has maintained the books, records and accounts of both the SJRU and NSW Juniors this year. Mark is a tireless supporter of junior rugby and his support and sage advice to the SJRU Committee has been greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank Nick Farr-Jones (Chairman of NSW Rugby) and Bruce Worboys (Executive Rugby NSW Rugby) for all their support in 2014.

There have been many changes in the NSW development team over the last twelve months but through thick and thin the three ARU Development teams continue to assist the Clubs and Districts in promoting Junior Rugby.

Congratulations to the Waratahs in winning the Super Rugby title this year. It was a great achievement! Michael Cheika and the Waratahs have continued to connect with grassroots rugby and as a result the March Past before the Waratahs v Brumbies match at ANZ Stadium on Saturday 28 June was the biggest March Past ever conducted for Junior Clubs. Congratulations to all the SJRU Junior Clubs that participated and supported the Waratahs.

The SJRU Committee continue to assist Kerry and Matt in administering and managing the SJRU Competitions for approximately 350 teams. I would like to thank each and every one of them for their unwavering support and their dedication to junior rugby. To those SJRU Committee members who are retiring this year I would like to thank you for the endless hours you have devoted to Junior Rugby and I hope that you continue to be involved in some capacity in the "game that they play in heaven".

There does not seem to be a summer break any more because Clubs are starting to run summer tag competitions, or as most administrators are aware, as soon as you finish one season you start to prepare for the next season. I hope that you find time to have a break during summer and I look forward to welcoming everyone back in 2015.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Sydney Junior Rugby Union posted a net profit of \$37,857 for the financial year ended 31 October 2014.

Income representing \$242,008 for the financial year comprised Club Administration and Participation Fees, Representative Player Fees and Finals Fees. Sponsorship and Donations largely comprised in kind contributions relating to Representative Teams apparel and related expenditures.

Expenditure representing \$204,151 for the financial year comprises Development expenditures of \$10,400, Event and Competition Expenditures of \$27,350, Representative Expenditures of \$48,822 and other administration expenditures of \$4,040.

During the year, the SJRU Committee incurred development expenditures relating to improving game day management including Ground Marshall and Trainer Apparel for all teams and signage relating to safety and crowd behaviour. Some development funds were utilised in provision of assistance to clubs with financial difficulties or volunteer and administration deficiencies.

Consistent with improving the standard of SJRU competition in relation to match standard, player safety and competition administration, additional expenditures for SJRU Competition management staff were incurred including expenditure on our competition management system to provide for maintenance and data integrity ahead of a transition to a new national competition management system in 2015.

Going forward, SJRU priority is to development funds investment in increasing player participation and safety, competition management services including more state of the art online communication systems, game day management and coaching and player education. The improving standards of our game over the last few years will continue with these additional investments.

Total Cash at hand at year end represented \$371,220 including \$340,782 in Investment Cash Accounts. All funds are held with Australian Trading banks, with CBA being the SJRU's primary bank.

While the improved cash position of SJRU provides for increased development activity in coming years to promote and develop Sydney Junior Rugby, SJRU is not in a position to fully fund all activities of the game that incorporates funding from ARU and NSW RU bodies.

Any significant change to current funding structure, will present challenges to the SJRU and its Clubs to provide a sustainable financial model that grows and develops the junior rugby player base.

I wish to thank the SJRU Committee, Kerry Brady, SJRU Administrator, Mark Green NSW RU and Tony Fisher President for their support during the year. I look forward to continuing to support the SJRU.

COMPETITION REPORT

Three hundred and seventy (370) teams successfully completed the 2014 season with 96 playing Grand Finals in September. Our Competition is the largest Junior Rugby competition in the country and the success of it is due to the cooperation and tireless work of the hundreds of Club volunteers.

This year we have witnessed an increased attendance at All Clubs meetings and Coach and Managers meetings whilst the newly instituted Grading meetings proved a huge success. Thanks must go to all Club committees who have been active in encouraging Club representatives to attend and participate in SJRU matters with suggestions and ideas to improve our competition.

The Grand Final weekend was a huge success despite the threatening weather conditions. The host Clubs Wahroonga, Mosman, Harbord, Randwick District and Wests worked tirelessly to ensure that all games were played in the best conditions possible.

This year Wests managed to secure the prestigious Concord Oval for five games whilst the two ovals at St Lukes hosted a total of 12 games. At the same time the U10s enjoyed the company of Tahman at Cliff Oval and the U11s played on the picturesque Rawson Oval. The Harbord Harlequins successfully managed the U12s Grand Finals after nights of drenching rain and the Randwick Clubs banded together to host the Friday night competition Grand Finals.

Thanks also go to all those Clubs who hosted semis and plate finals especially with the wet weather we experienced in August and September.

This years Junior March Past at ANZ Stadium prior to the Brumbies game was the largest ever with approximately 7,000 supporters and marchers in attendance – hopefully the 2015 March Past at the Crusaders game will be just as successful! Thanks must go to the Waratahs staff who this year have enabled an increased level of cooperation between Waratahs and Junior Rugby. The successful Club blitz, the many appearances of Tahman at Club events and the availability of Waratahs players at presentations are all due to the work of all the Waratahs staff, especially Lachlan Britt and Michael Cheika.

The perennial problem of grading saw an increased buy in from Clubs this year with well attended pre season and round 4 meetings. Clubs were able to voice concerns and suggestions and the meetings were judged a huge success. This initiative will continue in 2015.

One surprise was the large attendance at the Coach and Managers meeting at North Ryde RSL pre season. The venue there enables us to accommodate large numbers with unrestricted parking for attendees. Although not as central as Moore Park the many advantages of this venue make it ideal for these types of meetings. And for 2015 we will ensure seating is available for all!

For those players fortunate to be selected in representative teams the calendar was full and well organized thanks to Ben Gregory. This year SJRU selected both an U14 and U18 team in conjunction with our U15, U16 and U17s.

These teams competed against Country in Tamworth in July at a very successful City Country tournament. Thanks go to all the volunteer coaches, managers and selectors who gave the players such a wonderful representative experience.

Development this year included the attempt to start a Saturday Sevens competition at St Lukes Concord. Although not heavily supported we hope to initiate further programs especially on Saturdays in 2015. With the ARU Development Officers coming under the control of NSW RU in 2015 we anticipate greater coordination and liaison in the area of development. Meanwhile many Clubs have themselves been very proactive as regards development. Mosman, Wahroonga and Penrith RSL have conducted successful sevens programs, Dural continue to run their hugely successful summer Walla Tag competition and Beecroft-Cherrybrook implemented a series of school visits to aid recruitment and retention. To assist Clubs with recruitment SJRU purchased banners with the FutureTahs logo encouraging players to register and these were distributed to all Clubs early in the season. For 2015 SJRU is in the process of purchasing teardrop banners for Clubs to display at their grounds.

The Trytons program for children with special needs has once again been very well supported. Sessions are held at Koola Park and Nagle Park on weekends during the season and thanks must go to Lindfield JRC and Randwick District and to Steve Loane from North Rocks. Communication between SJRU and Clubs and also between Clubs is an extremely important aspect of our game. This year I have tried to ensure that Club contacts were kept fully informed of all matters via regular emails and phone calls. This year I have witnessed a need for greater communication regarding issues relating to Minis competitions. SJRU does not control Minis competitions but has received a plethora of requests this year for assistance with draws, judicial matters etc. To this end the new SJRU Constitution has created a position for a Director of Minis. This position, it is hoped, will enable better networking between the various Districts conducting Minis competitions and 2015 should see better coordination in this important area.

Finances are strong and enable SJRU to weather any reductions in grants and assistance from the ARU or NSW RU. SJRU must ensure that the health of our competition remains strong and a healthy bank account is the best insurance for this. Many thanks must also go to Mark Green of NSW RU who once again has been a vital contributor to SJRU with sage advice and by overseeing the accounts of SJRU.

COMPETITION REPORT

Sadly this year Junior Rugby has lost two stalwarts of the game. Brett Jacobson, President of Wakehurst JRC passed away suddenly at a very young age leaving a young family. The Wakehurst JRC have been instrumental in establishing a trust fund to support the family and I would like to thank all those who have generously contributed to this cause. Brett was an enthusiastic and innovative President and I certainly miss his regular phone calls to discuss various issues and ideas.

Barry Kilham, a past President of SJRU and NSWJRU and Board member of NSWRU also passed away suddenly. His contribution to Junior Rugby in the past was immense and his absence is sorely felt.

Season 2015 is shaping up to be one of the most challenging for a long time. Cut backs in funding from parent Unions, the imposition of per player insurance and participation levies and the transfer of control of development to NSWRU all pose serious implications for the game of Junior Rugby as we know it. Fortunately the SJRU is well placed to weather the storm and with diligent efforts from all concerned parties and fruitful and frank dialogue, solutions and compromises will be found. Communications on these matters will be on going over the "off season" so that all are prepared for the start of the new season.

Once again the Committee led by Tony Fisher has worked diligently to ensure that the competition runs smoothly and that all Club issues are addressed. Committee members have devoted an inordinate amount of time to Rugby and deserve appreciation for their efforts. Thanks and appreciation go to all Committee members and especially to Tony and Ben Gregory for their generous support and for the large amount of time they have expended in assisting me with the competition. Tony in particular has spent a lot of time this year on the new Constitution which ensures that all stakeholders can have a voice in all matters.

Matt Kellahan also has played a vital role in ensuring the competition runs smoothly – he willingly assists registrars and club personnel with various issues and almost single handedly coordinated all Judicial matters. To the various judiciary members we all owe a huge vote of thanks. These members willingly give up their time to ensure that all matters are dealt with fairly and in a timely manner.

We also owe a vote of thanks to all the referees who continue to contribute to the game and ensure that the players can play safely each weekend.

To all the staff at both NSWRU and the Waratahs my thanks for your support during the season...this job is made more enjoyable and fulfilling by your enthusiasm and encouragement.

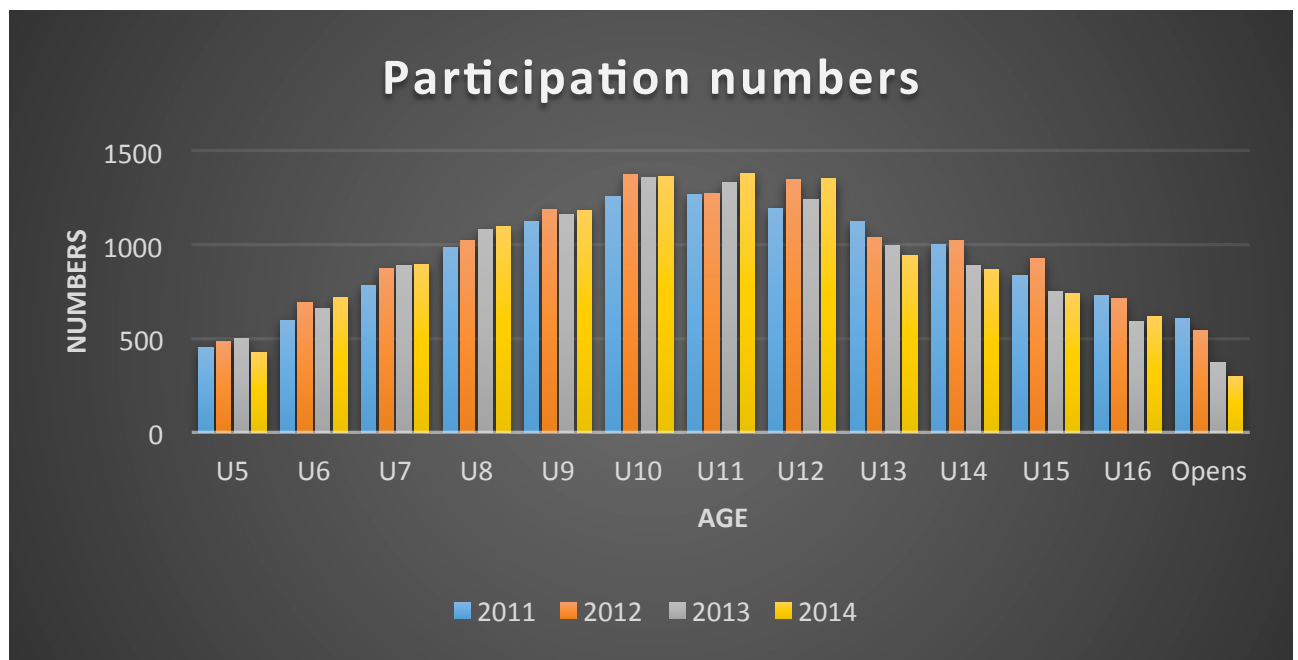

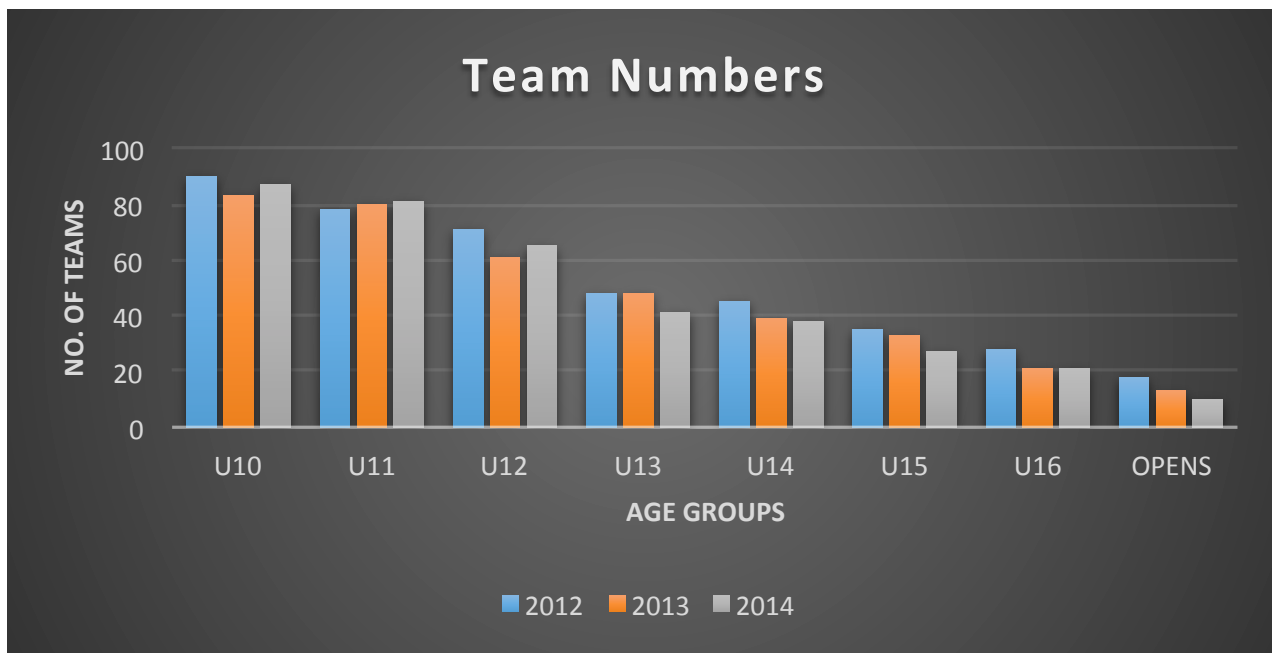

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

It is my pleasure to report on development related activities within Sydney Junior Rugby Union. Before I touch on some of the initiatives and successes in 2014 I would like to recognise the contribution of the SJRU Committee in the development effort throughout the season.

Community rugby cannot operate effectively without the tireless contribution of club volunteers. I would like to thank the volunteers for their efforts throughout the season; they are appreciated by teams, clubs and officials. I trust the volunteers all feel a sense of satisfaction from their involvement in the game especially when they see the minis and juniors take the field each weekend.

2014 was another year of opportunities and challenges for club rugby. With recruitment, retention and grass roots rugby the main areas of focus for the season we began to develop strategies to assist the clubs to achieve within these areas. The challenge is to become more targeted, to attract and retain players in the junior grades whilst growing minis. We have a number of initiatives this season including those run by the ARU support team to begin to address these focus areas.

The aim for grass roots rugby was to drive and increase participation and to maximise new registrations. Having had feedback from many clubs and officials, our goal was to improve the visibility and access to the ARU staff and schools program. A significant schools program rolled out across the metropolitan area, closely followed by clubs to continue the good work and to convert new players. Whilst there are challenges in measuring the conversion from these programs to new registrations, we have as a code, offered a valuable learning and playing experience to hundreds of primary school children. This schools based initiative is supported through the Futuretahs program from NSW RU, the futuretahs.com.au website records registration details which, in the near future become a source of new player registration details for clubs to convert.

Each year we battle against other winter codes that are far better funded, yet we continue to attract a strong following and participation – again another credit to all those club volunteers in community rugby. Minis represent the largest opportunity to grow our game; they are the feeder for the junior competition. Following feedback at All Club meetings, Season 2015 will hold further initiatives directed at mini's recruitment and retention.

Our goal, in conjunction with the ARU, is to continue to improve the quality of our match officials and coaches, which will in turn enhance the player experience. The Coach and Match Official education program aims to deliver greater capability, management and safety. This year pathway referee recruitment has increased and we must continue to drive recruitment of coaches and match officials into and throughout next season. Next year the development team continues to support the identification and development of match officials with support and resources.

Another stand out program this season was the very successful 7's competitions, both the girls and boys during the season and then the Spring Sevens competition. The 7's competitions have drawn great interest and represent another avenue to retain and grow player numbers in critical age groups.

The SJRU development fund has been utilised in a number of ways this year – to support clubs fund small projects, recruitment initiatives, disadvantaged player funding, team and match official vests, banners and signage. An application form is available on the SJRU website.

First Aid was again a priority for SJRU. The implementation of plans and procedures has led to a vast improvement in actions at games particularly across multiple field venues. The introduction of compulsory first aid requirements along with introducing first aid suppliers saw the game coverage and response times improve again this season. I would take this opportunity to thank clubs for their support of this program.

The ARU development team continue to work with clubs and districts, I would like to thank them for their efforts this season, and I also would like to thank Michael Doyle and Adam Crane for their leadership and engagement during the year.

The SJRU development team and committee continue to work on and invest in the initiatives for next season and we look forward to a great season 2015.

REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

The Representative Program in 2014 faced a number of challenges. We saw a number of changes implemented into the Representative Pathway with the inception of the JGC and the cancellation of the U16 Nationals all impacting on the 2014 program. Plus the late removal of the Grandfather clause in the under 16's meant that we had some new hurdles to jump through with regard to eligibility for Reps.

Preparations started extremely well as we saw the most applications for Representative Coaches and Managers that we have received for many years. The selection panel interviewed all applicants and we were able to nominate the coaching teams for the various Zone, Sydney and NSWJRU teams by February – this gave us a massive head start going into the season to be as prepared as we could possibly be, which was a great result.

State Championships

The first step in the Representative pathway was the NSWJRU State Championships (U11 to U17) which was held in early June. This year we had the following venues host State Championships (and the winners/ runners-up);

- **U11's - Keirle Park, Manly**
 - Manly defeated Gordon
- **U12's - Camden Rugby Club, Camden**
 - Penrith 19 defeated Manly 0
- **U13's - Wanderers Rugby Club, Newcastle**
 - Gordon 48 defeated Southern Districts 17
- **U14's - Endeavour Park, Orange**
 - Act 17 defeated Gordon 10
- **U15's - Drummoyne Oval**
 - Northern Suburbs 24 defeated Randwick 0
- **U16's - St Lukes Fields, Concord**
 - Gordon 26 drew with ACT 26 (Joint Premiers)
- **U17's - St Lukes Fields, Concord**
 - Central Coast 33 defeated West Harbour 10

This year saw Drummoyne Oval as the host of the finals for the older age groups and it proved to be huge success. Many thanks to the folk from Drummoyne Junior Rugby Club.

Regionals

From the State Championships we saw the next level of Representative teams picked which would be showcased at the Regional tournament which was held at Grantham Oval, Blacktown. Independent selectors were at all the U14 to U17's matches and selected players to be showcased in front of the Sydney selectors at the Regionals in late June.

The U14's selected approximately 40 players (possibles & probables) from the State Championships in Orange and these lads were trained as a group by the Sydney Coaches before playing a selection trial for the Sydney side.

The U15's and U16's were selected into the three zones (Western Zone, Northern Zone, Southern Zone) and the Barbarians. These four sides played a round robin tournament in front of the Sydney selectors and following the tournament they selected the Sydney Representative teams.

The U17's chose a possibles and probables squad from the State Championships and these players played a selection trial in front of the Sydney selectors.

For the first time we selected a Sydney U18's side. With the limited number of U18's eligible players in juniors, we opened selection to age eligible players that are currently in colts but had played juniors for an SJRU club prior. The U18's then played a possible v probable selection trial from which the Sydney team was selected.

City v Country

The first game for the Sydney teams was for the U17's and U18's whom played a visiting schools side from Trinity College in London. The games were held at Boronia Park, Hunters Hill with the U17's playing the Trinity 2nd XV and the U18's playing the Trinity 1st XV. The spoils were shared on the day with the U17's having a solid victory and the U18's going down narrowly in a very tight game.

With HSC commitments affecting many of the lads, we played the U18's City v Country as a stand-alone match in Maitland in mid July. City were victorious 15-12 over a the gallant Country side.

In late July we took the annual City v Country clash to Tamworth. It was a fair commitment from the City boys with a 6 hour bus ride late on Saturday afternoon not the ideal preparation – but we were keen to help give back to the fine rugby folk in the North of the State.

The games were as tight as I can recall in recent times, with the following results

- **U14s SJRU 15 defeated CJRU 0**
- **U15s SJRU 26 defeated CJRU 10**
- **U16s CJRU 10 drew with SJRU 10**
- **U17s CJRU 40 defeated SJRU 7**

From this carnival we selected the NSWJRU sides for the U15's and U17's age groups

NSW Invitational (U16's)

With the ARU cancelling the U16's Nationals, we spent a lot of time and energy trying to create an offering for this generation of Rep players so they would not miss out on the traditional highlight of this age group.

NSWRU got behind the idea and created the inaugural NSW Invitational which will be focused around the SJRU, CJRU and NSW Schools sides, plus any sides from the other states that choose to accept the invitation to join.

REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

As this year's program was affected by the late cancellation of the ARU Nationals, many of these other states either chose not to select sides, organized other tours or simply didn't have the funding left after the JGC to enter a team. So we rounded off this year's carnival with a Western Sydney Invitation side entering.

The games were for the most part all very tight with the NSW Schools team taking the title with some impressive displays. The SJRU team lost all three of their games by a combined total of 7 points which reflects the closeness of the games. Results were as follows

- **NSW Schools 29 defeated NSW Country 14**
- **Western Sydney Rams 15 defeated SJRU 12**
- **NSW Schools 52 defeated Western Sydney Rams 0**
- **NSW Country 26 defeated SJRU 24**
- **Western Sydney Rams 25 defeated NSW Country 17**
- **NSW Schools 15 defeated SJRU 12**

NSWJRU Teams

Following the annual City v Country clash we selected a NSWJRU side in the U15's and U17's. Traditionally these sides would meet a team from Queensland and often also the ACT or Victoria. Unfortunately the advent of the JGC meant that Queensland didn't select State sides this year and the ACT teams followed the JGC pathway, meaning that the NSW teams selected had no-one to play.

So with no official games to play we wanted to be able to offer these players some meaningful experience for being selected in a NSWJRU team.

The Waratahs came to the rescue and all the NSW players went thru the "Waratah Way" which was an elite training camp at NSWRU headquarters followed by an official jersey presentation prior to the Sydney Stars vs Brisbane City NRC game at Leichhardt Oval.

We also organized for these teams to have a game to be able to round off the NSW experience. We created an U16's Presidents XV (from the players not involved in the U16 NSW Invitational) for the NSW U15's to play and the Sydney U18's would take on the NSW U17's team. Brisbane Juniors did then show an interest in joining this weekend, but unfortunately this didn't eventuate.

Both these games were scheduled for the same weekend as the NSW Invitational at TG Milner to truly round off a festival of junior rugby. And also most likely a last hurrah for the NSWJRU teams in this format as future State teams will be selected via the JGC.

Results were as follows

- **NSW U15's 26 defeated Presidents XV 0**
- **Sydney U18's 22 defeated NSW U17's 17**

Despite the various challenges it has been a successful Representative program for 2014. The SJRU committee will hold a review in the offseason with items such as JGC impact, removal of Grandfather clause impact etc to be reviewed.

But 2015 already looks just as exciting.

The committee has worked very hard with our counterparts at Country Junior Rugby in streamlining our pathways and this should see the State Championships and Regionals both build into even bigger and better carnivals in 2015.

The NSW Invitational went very well in its inaugural year and I'd expect it to grow in stature in the next few seasons as the other states, indigenous teams and possibly teams from overseas getting involved.
