# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

As 2015 draws to a close Sydney Junior Rugby Union (SJRU) has completed another successful season of Junior Club rugby.

As stated in my 2014 President's Report the financial challenge for all Clubs in 2015 was the introduction of the Player Participation Levy of \$11.00 for Under 6's and Under 7's and \$27.50 for Under 8's to Under 18's by the Australian Rugby Union (ARU). Through our negotiations with New South Wales Rugby (NSWRU) and the ARU over the Christmas / New Year period it was agreed that NSWRU would levy \$11.00 for Under 6's to Under 9's and \$27.50 for Under 10's to Under 18's. At the beginning of 2015 the SJRU Board agreed to absorb some of this cost and as a result the actual increase that was passed onto the Clubs was \$11.00 per player for Under 6's to Under 18's. As a result of absorbing some of this additional cost it has had an adverse effect on the financial result of the SJRU for 2015 and we have declared a loss of \$13,746. However as a result of the good governance instituted at the SJRU over the last five years we have been able to easily absorb this loss. As at 31 August 2015 we had Member's Funds of \$320,141 and so we remain in a strong financial position.

From 1 January 2015 the NSW Development team moved back from the ARU to NSWRU. As a result of this change, the cuts in funding from the ARU to NSWRU and the introduction of the Player Participation Levy we have seen significant cuts to the services being delivered by the NSW Development team in 2015. The task for 2016 is to ensure that the SJRU and its Districts and Clubs are able to maximise the benefits we receive from the NSW Development team.

In October 2015 the SJRU was involved in the selection panel for the NSW Game Development Manager and we welcome the successful candidate Andrew Hill who will bring a lot of vigour and enthusiasm to the role. We would like to thank the previous incumbents Mike Doyle and Adam Crane for all their input into the development of rugby in NSW. Thank you also to the three NSW Rugby Development teams in the Sydney metropolitan area who continue to assist the Districts and Clubs in promoting Junior Rugby.

In addition as a result of the AFL's and NRL's new broadcast deals they have significant resources to devote to development. We are currently working with NSW Rugby to ensure that rugby's development resources are deployed in the most effective manner and that the Western Sydney review delivers a positive outcome for junior rugby.

As well as introducing the Player Participation Levy in 2015 the ARU also tried to introduce per player insurance and Rugby Link both with disastrous consequences!

The per player insurance levy was not accepted by the constituents of NSW Rugby and as a result we have remained with Clubs being levied insurance on a per team basis. I have been told anecdotally that in NSW the insurers collected the required amount of premium while in the states that adopted the per player insurance levy the required amount of premium was not raised.

Despite the ARU exerting significant pressure on the Board of the SJRU to move to Rugby Link we remained with Buddha as the SJRU Board did not believe that the Rugby Link player administration and competition management system could support the SJRU Districts, Clubs and players. With the benefit of hindsight this decision was 100% correct when you look at

the angst that the NSW Subbies administrators and Clubs endured and the resultant additional workload.

In July 2015 the SJRU Board received further support for this decision when we were advised by the ARU that they support the decision of the SJRU Board to use MyRUGBY in 2016. MyRUGBY is being developed by the people that originally developed Buddha. The SJRU is working very closely with MyRUGBY to develop a system that is at the forefront of administration and competition management of sport in Australia. You will first experience MyRUGBY when you register your son or daughter for 2016 and then during the season when you will be able to sign on your team electronically and be able to get live score updates whether you are at the ground, out shopping or somewhere else in the world.

The current time line for the release of MyRUGBY is as follows:-

  - MyRUGBY player registration system and online payment of registration fees
  - MyRUGBY websites
- 30 November 2015
  - MyRUGBY competition management system
- 31 December 2015
  - Team communication App
- 28 February 2016
  - MyRUGBY match day App
  - MyRUGBY referee appointments system
- 31 March 2016
  - MyRUGBY ecommerce

I would like to thank all the people from the SJRU Clubs who have been involved in the development and testing of MyRUGBY. A special thank you to Sarah Mullette, Jane Carpenter, Tricia Waters, Sam Gall and Matt Kellahan who been involved in the development of MyRUGBY from Day 1.

I would like to thank the SJRU Board for their advice and unwavering support as we endured many days of tough negotiations with both the ARU and NSWRU in relation to Player Participation Fees, Per Player Insurance Levies and Rugby Link.

The SJRU has two fantastic administrators in Kerry Brady, the SJRU Competitions Manager, and Matt Kellahan, the SJRU Competition Administrator. Both administrators put in countless hours during the rugby season so that we have a well-managed competition. On behalf of the SJRU rugby community I would like to thank Kerry and Matt for their sterling efforts during 2015.

Kerry and Matt are ably assisted by the SJRU Board. I would like to thank the Board for their dedication and support of Junior District and Club Rugby in the Sydney metropolitan area. A number of SJRU Board members are retiring this year and I would like to thank each and every one of them for the endless hours they have devoted to Junior Club Rugby and I hope that you continue to be involved in some capacity in the "game that they play in heaven". Many Clubs are running summer 7's programs and it is a form of rugby that we should continue to develop in 2016.

In 2015 the SJRU continued to support Trytons Rugby which introduces rugby to children with Special Needs. Trytons Rugby is conducted at a number of centres across the Sydney metropolitan area during winter.

# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The player numbers in the younger age groups remain strong but we continue to have concerns with player numbers in the older age groups. The Friday Night Competition remains strong in the Under 10 to Under 12 age groups. In 2015 the SJRU worked with the Premiership Clubs to set up an Under 18's Competition as part of their Colts program. This initiative was reasonably successful but the Board of the SJRU believes that Club Championship points must be allocated to the Under 18's Competition otherwise Premiership Districts will continue to cannibalise the Under 18's team to ensure they have players for their Colts teams.

Ortho Sport continued to provide first aid at the home matches of many of the SJRU Clubs as well as at Final Series matches and representative fixtures. The SJRU Board continues to believe that it is essential that Clubs provide first aid at all home matches so that parents are comforted that there is an experienced first aid person on hand if their child happens to be injured during a match.

We continue to see an improvement in the behaviour of both players and spectators. However we have a number of rogue coaches and Clubs in our ranks whose behaviour continues to sully the name of Junior Rugby. These coaches and Clubs have a win at all costs attitude and do not ensure that all players in their team get maximum enjoyment from the "game that they play in heaven". As a result the SJRU Board will work with the Development team of NSW Rugby to develop a course for coaches on the management of players and parents as well as ensuring that every player in the team gets an equal opportunity to develop their rugby skills.

In 2015 we saw a reduction in the number of players sent off and suspended. The SJRU Judiciary Committee continues to do a fantastic job and was again ably led by Mark Ashhurst as Judiciary Chairman and Dougal Geddes as Citing Officer.

In 2015 the SJRU and NSW CJRU agreed to incorporate the NSW Country Championships into the NSW State Championships where the SJRU Districts contested the Metropolitan Championships while NSW CJRU contested the Country Championships and then there was a cross over between both groups to determine the NSW State Champions in each age group from Under 15's to Under 17's. The concept had its teething problems and unfortunately NSW Country Juniors have decided to return to the old system and run a Country Championships for these age groups in 2016. The Board of the SJRU is disappointed with this decision as we believe it is very short sighted.

On a positive note NSW CJRU entered two teams in the NSW Juniors Regionals which gives the elite players the opportunity to showcase their talents against other elite rugby players of their own age. The addition of two Country teams to this tournament was a success.

The SJRU has had another very successful representative rugby season with Sydney Juniors defeating NSW Country Juniors in the Under 14's, Under 15's, Under 16's, Under 17's and Under 18's.

In conjunction with NSW RU the SJRU again conducted a very successful Under 16 invitational carnival with teams from SJRU, NSW CJRU, NSW Schools and a NSW JRU Under 15 team.

The Australian Rugby Union (ARU) will continue to conduct the Junior Gold Cup for Under 15's and Under 17's during the

summer of 2015 / 2016. There has been a great response from the players wishing to be considered for this program even though there were a reduced number of teams selected in the Under 17's.

Over the last few years the SJRU and NSW JRU Representative programs have been run by Ben Gregory who has streamlined the program, introduced many new initiatives and devised a development pathway for coaches. Ben has decided not to seek re-election for 2016 and so I would like to thank him for all his dedication and hard work in running a very successful representative program.

I would like to thank the three District Referee Associations for providing referees for all SJRU competition and representative matches as well as the work they do in coaching and developing referees for Junior Rugby. In addition I would like to thank all the match officials for their dedication and commitment during the season as they are an integral part of the game of rugby.

The Board of SJRU would like to thank all the parents and guardians who volunteer to coach and manage the 350 teams in our Junior Competitions or assist in many other capacities such as trainer, assistant referee, ground marshal or help in the canteen or on the BBQ. In this day and age where everyone has very busy lives it is becoming more and more difficult to encourage people to volunteer. So to those people who do volunteer thank you for putting time back into the community and our children. I hope that you get as much enjoyment from volunteering as the players get from your participation.

Junior Club Rugby in the Sydney metropolitan area caters for children from Under 6 to Under 18. We have 12 Districts, more than 60 Clubs and 13,000 players and so thank you to all the volunteers that devote countless hours each week in running the Junior Districts and Clubs because, without you, the players would never have the opportunity to participate in, and enjoy, our great game.

A special thank you to Mark Green (General Manager - Administration & Competitions, NSW Rugby) who has maintained the books, records and accounts of both the SJRU and NSW Juniors this year. Mark is a tireless supporter of Junior Rugby and his support and sage advice to the SJRU Board has been greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank Nick Farr-Jones (Chairman of NSW Rugby), Geoff Ferris (NSW Youth Director) and Bruce Worboys (Executive Rugby NSW Rugby) for all their support in 2015.

Congratulations to the Wallabies in reaching the World Cup final. The success, humility and change in attitude that Michael Cheika has brought to the Wallabies has reengaged the fickle rugby fan base and let's hope that it has a positive flow on effect with player registration numbers in 2016.

I wish everyone an enjoyable break over summer and look forward to welcoming all the players, officials and volunteers back for 2016.

# COMPETITION REPORT

Season 2015 was successfully concluded with the Grand Finals on September 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> with 70 Grand Finals being conducted for Plate and Competitions. For the first time we held Plate finals together with the Competition Grand Finals as the season had been disrupted due to wet weather. This format appeared to be quite successful with all teams playing a 15<sup>th</sup> round with the top 4 place getters entering into elimination finals.

Once again the host Clubs of Hawkesbury, Wahoonga, Randwick Juniors, Wests and Norwest are to be congratulated for the effort and time they put in to make the Grand Finals so successful. This season we instituted an entrance fee at Concord Oval which has been used to defray the first aid expenses for the grand finals.

This year over 7,000 players registered for Sydney Junior competitions in the U10s to Opens age groups. Numbers in these age groups however have been gradually diminishing since a maximum of over 8,000 players in 2012. The decrease is most apparent in the U13s to Opens age groups. Numbers are healthy in the Minis age groups and have shown an increase over the past few years. The challenge is to have these players continue playing Club rugby beyond the U12/13 age groups. Sydney Juniors hopes to address some of these concerns in 2016 and with the appointment of the new General Manager for Development we are aiming for greater liaison between the development staff of NSWRU and Sydney Juniors.

One new feature this year was the formation of the U18 Colts Competition. This was initiated to help bridge the gap between our Opens competition and the colts competitions at Premiership and Subbies clubs. It was also hoped that by having games on a Saturday prior to the Premiership Colts games we would attract back to Rugby many past Junior players not playing school Rugby. Whilst not a total success this year with only five teams commencing the season the concept is worth pursuing with vigour in 2016.

Our competition however is still an attractive sport option for many families and with successful grading in the larger competitions we offer a safe environment for junior players. The weight/age issue once again has been discussed and is the subject of reports and opinions from various Clubs and individuals. This issue is certainly contentious and is one that cannot be ignored nor can any immediate decisions be made. It is hoped that further detailed submissions will be taken and recommendations made to the Board for eventual implementation if deemed feasible.

Once again grading/regrading meetings were well attended and have proved very successful with all Clubs. All involved are now conversant with the value and ethos behind them and in 2016 this format will definitely be continuing.

A highlight of the Junior Calendar has always been the Junior March Past and 2015 saw this held prior to the Waratahs Vs Crusaders match which was a replay of the 2014 Super 15 final. The March past was extremely well attended with over 5,000 Junior players marching. The evening ran smoothly thanks to the cooperation of all attendees and the great advance planning of the Waratahs and ANZ staff. 2016 sees the March Past being held at Allianz Stadium before the Bulls game in May. Logistics and assembly will be a challenge with the smaller venue.

Season 2015 saw a total of 540 accreditations awarded for courses such as Foundation, Refereeing Kids and on line Assistant Refereeing Courses. This number is well down on previous years and Clubs are urged to ensure that all teams have accredited coaches and assistant referees.

During this season an enormous amount of effort has been expended developing a new on-line system for Juniors. This new system, MyRugby will incorporate many new features and has had a lot of input from various Club personnel as well as by the team at MyRugby. An invitation was extended to all Clubs earlier in the year for any interested person to assist with the development of MyRugby. A total of 16 people have been involved to varying degrees and the system will certainly be Club and registrar friendly. There will also be development of a Match day app to make sign on and score reporting easier for everyone. It is an exciting time with the new system to be unveiled to Clubs and training for registrars all occurring in November ready for the new season!

With the new system up and running for 2016 it is envisaged that the workload on Clubs will lighten especially as regards their financial payments. Previously Sydney Juniors has invoiced Clubs for their fees but the new system will enable split payment so that all on line registration payments will have the various components sent directly to the various entities.

The new levy imposed by the ARU on all players caused much concern to both Clubs and the SJRU. As well as the financial imposition, the payment method and reporting system was not well received by most Unions and affiliates. Fortunately Tony Fisher, Chairman of SJRU managed to lobby NSWRU and the ARU and reached an agreement that U6s-U9s would be charged only \$11 each and the older age groups \$27.50 per player. Due to Sydney Juniors good financial state the SJRU Board also agreed to reduce the financial burden on Clubs by lowering the SJRU participation and admin fees. This reduced the financial burden on all Clubs for 2015.

It is pleasing to record a reduction in Judicial offences this season. Both Matt and I as well as our valued judiciary members have been fortunate to have had few Wednesday evening judiciaries as many of the reported offences were able to be offered an early guilty plea. However we have noticed an increase in spectator misbehaviour and complaints regarding parent behaviour on the sidelines. In many cases Presidents have been instrumental in addressing concerns at the Club level and ensuring that the Code of Conduct is distributed and adhered to. The cooperation from all Clubs regarding spectator behaviour has been superb this year and it is hoped that this will continue next season.

Many issues arise during the season but one that has recurred many times is the issue of fair play and sportsmanship by coaches. It is unfortunate that there are still a large number of junior coaches who have a "win at all costs" attitude. Whilst numbers of Rugby players are decreasing we need to ensure that ALL players are valued and encouraged not just the very small number of elite players.



# COMPETITION REPORT

The ethics of coaching and junior rugby needs to be addressed by all Clubs and Club committees need to be rigorous in their appointment of coaches. Many a Club has regretted the appointment of a "gun coach" who is only interested in his team and the winning of a trophy...these Clubs often have reduced participation rates in subsequent years!

Whilst there are a small number of elite players the vast majority wish to play good competitive Rugby with their mates...perhaps we need to look at different scenarios eg flexible seasons, shorter comps and seven a side games to ensure our participation levels increase.

Our Representative program, run by Ben Gregory, has catered extremely well for the elite players with a wealth of games and opportunities for selection to higher levels. Ben has submitted a comprehensive report and it is only left to me to thank Ben for the tremendous effort he has expended for all these players and for Sydney Juniors.

The success of the program is a testament to the time and effort he has put in. Ben has instituted protocols and procedures which should ensure that the Representative program continues in good shape now that he has resigned.

Communication between and to Clubs is of prime importance to both Matt and I as well as to the SJRU Board. Weekly updates hopefully keep all Clubs informed of important issues and attendance at regular All Clubs meetings enables further discussion and debate of important topics. Both Matt and I encourage all Club committees to be in touch with any issues or problems. We also would encourage Districts to broaden their focus from just representative matters and be a voice and forum for all issues pertaining to Club rugby.

The minis competitions conducted by Districts are an important development step for Junior Rugby. In 2016 we have a position on the Board for Minis and the director will be facilitating communication between Districts on issues relating to Minis. We hope to host a meeting before season 2016 with all the convenors of the Minis competitions. SJRU is acknowledging the important work that Districts do as regards Minis and wishes to assist and facilitate and ensure that communication and sharing of ideas is enhanced.

Season 2015 saw an increase in the number of Clubs who availed themselves of the SJRU coordinated First Aid attendants. This season 28 Clubs had their home game First Aid attendants appointed by Ortho Sports and Sydney Juniors billed the Clubs on a per player basis. Obviously coordinating such a large number of attendants each week is a huge task and thanks go to Narelle Veverka who handled this for Sydney Juniors. The presence of First Aid at all games is a reassuring measure for parents and should be promoted as a recruitment/retention asset.

For 2016 SJRU will be aiming to further assist all Clubs with the reporting requirements of the Working With Children legislation as well as all other statutory requirements. Presentations and communications on legislation and various compliance issues will be sent to Clubs on a regular basis.

Thanks must go to Scott Rogan and the 3 referee associations for their patience and commitment especially during this year

with wet weather impacting appointments. However it should be noted by all Clubs that referee numbers are diminishing and it is extremely important that Clubs do everything possible to recruit new referees for Junior Rugby.

All the NSW development staff are to be congratulated and thanked for their continued attention to Sydney Juniors and their willingness to assist with all matters raised both by Clubs and the SJRU Board. 2016 ushers in a new phase in this relationship with a new General Manager, Rugby Development, Andrew Hill appointed for NSW.

Once again Mazda and Spartan have assisted the competition by supplying Rugby balls for all Clubs. Their support is appreciated by both the Board and all Clubs and we hope that this sponsorship can be continued for many more years.

The smooth running of any competition let alone one as large as Sydney Juniors does not happen without the cooperation and expertise of many people. The Board of Sydney Juniors, led by Tony Fisher, has met each month and consulted continuously via email over all the issues important to Clubs. The Board relies on feedback from Presidents and Committees and works tirelessly to improve the competition and increase participation. All Board members, particularly Tony are to be thanked for their tremendous efforts over the year.

Personally I wish to acknowledge the work and enthusiasm that Tony, as Chairman does for Sydney Juniors and the assistance that he gives Matt and myself in running the competition.

Appreciation must go to Mark Green, Bruce Worboys and all the staff at NSW RU for their assistance and advice with everything connected with rugby. Their help is well valued and Sydney Juniors benefits from the close alliance with all the NSW staff. Thanks must also go to Matt Kellahan who has willingly given his assistance to all tasks asked of him and single-handedly took charge of all Judicial matters pertaining to our competition. His advice and commitment this year especially in relation to the new MyRugby system has been very much appreciated.

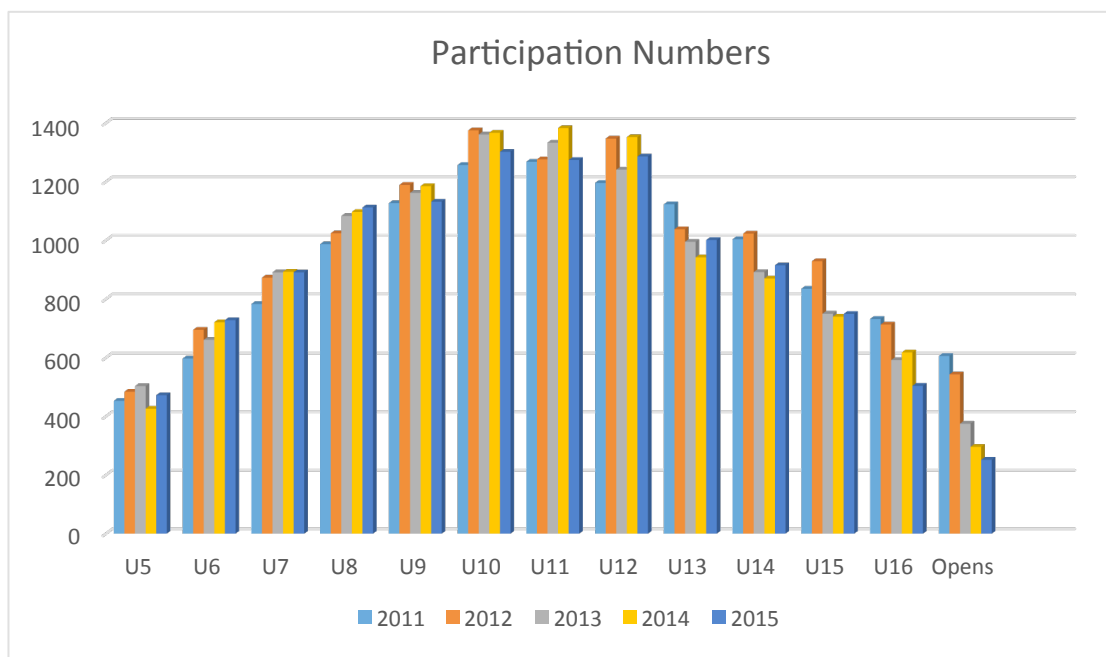

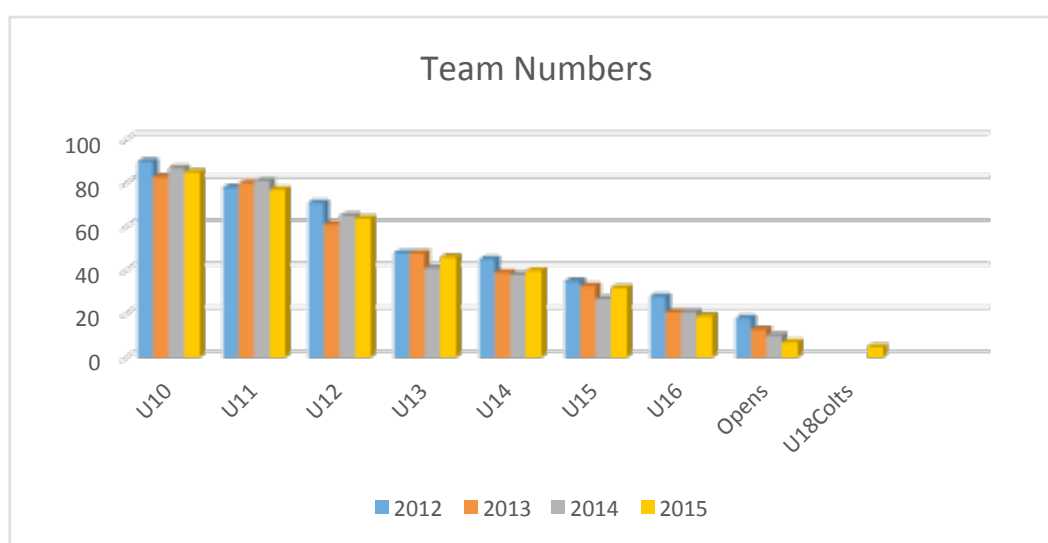

# REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

The 2015 Representative Program was designed to build upon the progress we made in 2014 in aligning the SJRU pathway with the various ARU JGC (Junior Gold Cup) and CJRU (Country Juniors) programs. Our aim was to provide a representative pathway for our club rugby players that had meaningful value, whilst being both time and cost effective.

Preparations started extremely well as we again saw plenty of applications for Representative Coaches and Managers. The selection panel interviewed all applicants and we were able to nominate the coaching teams for the various Zone, Sydney and NSWJRU teams very early in the year giving us a massive head start going into the season.

I cannot name all the coaches, assistant coaches, trainers and managers that were part of the program. But I would like to thank them all for their efforts this year in making the season the success which it was. This is my last year as part of the SJRU committee and it has been a pleasure working with you all. Many of you have been involved every year for the past six seasons I have been on committee and without the involvement of people like yourselves the game would be much poorer.

## State Championships

The first step in the Representative pathway was the NSWJRU State Championships (U12 to U17 with U10 and U11 holding Gala day formats) which was held in early June. This year we had the following venues host State Championships (and the winners/ runners-up);

- **U10's - Warringah Rugby Park, Narrabeen**
  - Gala Day format – no finals
- **U11's - Blackman Park, Lane Cove**
  - Gala Day format – no finals
- **U12's - Camden Rugby Club, Camden**
  - Gordon 17 defeated Manly 5
- **U13's - Drummoyne Oval, Drummoyne**
  - Manly 19 defeated Sydney University 12
- **U14's - Endeavour Park, Orange**
  - Gordon 22 defeated Southern Districts 7
- **U15's - Glen Willow Sporting Complex, Mudgee**
  - Gordon 21 defeated Northern Suburbs 12
- **U16's - St Lukes Fields, Concord**
  - ACTJRU 13 defeated Northern Suburbs 3
- **U17's - St Lukes Fields, Concord**
  - Penrith 17 defeated Southern Districts 15

The major change in 2015 was the experiment of aligning the Country Championships (for U15-U17) into the NSWJRU State Championship weekend. The idea being the Country lads would only need travel for one bigger carnival, saving them both time and money - Whilst at the same time increasing the participation at the State Championship level. This meant creating a Metro Championship to run side-by-side with the Country Champs on day 1 of the carnival before splitting into the various Cup/Bowl/Plate divisions of the State Championships.

Upon reflection the experiment was mildly successful, but it did have teething issues with some teams playing each other in the Country/Metro Champs and then meeting again in the State Champs due to results.

We also had the issue of some teams forfeiting Plate/ Bowl finals by leaving early on the last day. Should this concept be tried again it would only work as one tournament and not with a Country/Metro Champs as it's initial pool rounds. The U15's was easily the most successful age group in this format.

Many thanks to the clubs and their hardworking committees that hosted State Champs in 2015. We had great feedback on all venues and thank you for your contributions to junior Rep rugby.

## Regionals

From the State Championships we saw the next level of Representative teams picked which would be showcased at the Regional tournament held at Boronia Park, Hunters Hill. Another of our initiatives this year was to have two teams from CJRU entered into the U15's and U16's which played as Country Black and Country Gold.

This made the tournament a much larger event and a true showcase of junior. Both CJRU and SJRU used the tournament to select their Country and Sydney sides. Independent selectors were at all the U14 to U17's matches in the State Championships and selected players to be showcased in front of the Sydney selectors at the Regionals in late June.

The U14's selected approximately 40 players (possibles & probables) from the State Championships in Orange and these lads were trained as a group by the Sydney Coaches before playing a selection trial for the Sydney side at the Regionals.

The U15's and U16's were selected into the three zones (Western Zone, Northern Zone, Southern Zone) and the Barbarians. These four sides played a round robin tournament in front of the Sydney selectors and following the tournament they selected the Sydney Representative teams.

The U17's chose a Sydney squad directly from the State Championships whilst the U18's Sydney side was chosen from a special trial day held in late May. Both these teams played against Country at the Regionals Carnival.

## City v Country

The U17's and U18's kicked off these traditional clashes by meeting at the Regionals. The games were highly entertaining and a great showpiece of the weekend in front of a large crowd. Sydney snatched victory in the U17's game with the last play of the game in a highly entertaining match. The U18 Country lads came within a whisker as they came back from an early deficit, storming home in the second half but the Sydney lads held on.

In early August we saw the Annual City v Country fixtures held at TG Milner, Eastwood. The U17's would play for a second time following their previous close encounter and after the last time everyone was keen for this rematch. The games were exciting and hard fought with the following results

- **U14s SJRU 27 defeated CJRU 14**
- **U15s SJRU 42 defeated CJRU 7**
- **U16s SJRU 29 defeated CJRU 20**
- **U17s SJRU 38 defeated CJRU 17**

From this carnival we saw the NSWJRU side for the U15's selected.

# REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

## NSWJRUI Teams

Following the annual City v Country clash we selected a NSWJRUI side in the U15's. Traditionally these sides would meet a team from Queensland and often also the ACT or Victoria. Unfortunately the advent of the JGC in recent years has meant that Queensland don't select State sides and the ACT teams followed the JGC pathway also meaning that the NSWJRUI team selected had no traditional rivals to play. As these lads are the cream of their age group we decided to enter them in the U16 NSW Invitational.

## NSW Invitational (U16's)

For the second year since the cancellation of the U16's nationals, NSW has run the NSW Invitational. Teams from the U16's SJRU, CJRU and NSW Schools sides were joined by the NSWJRUI U15's Rep side in a four way round robin tournament.

Sides from the other states were invited and hopefully as this carnival grows they too will send sides to compete. ACT and Vic have already indicated interest for 2016.

The games were for the most part all very tight with the NSW Schools team taking the title with some impressive displays. Results were as follows

- **NSW Schools 26 defeated NSW Country 0**
- **NSWJRUI U15's 12 lost to SJRU 14**
- **NSW Schools 22 defeated NSWJRUI U15's 7**
- **NSW Country 15 lost to SJRU 19**
- **NSWJRUI U15's 17 lost to NSW Country 22**
- **NSW Schools 14 defeated SJRU 5**

## Other fixtures for SJRU teams

In an effort to give the Rep program some more meaning for the players involved (in U17's and U18's) we expanded the program with games against some schoolboy rep teams, touring UK schools and some Sydney colts teams.

Apart from the Country clashes the U17's had games against

- **Bishop Stortford 2<sup>nd</sup> XV**
- **Wellingborough 1<sup>st</sup> XV**
- **Penrith 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Colts (majority which were U17's)**
- **Southern Districts U18 Colts (prelude to an NRC clash)**
- **Bowral 7's tournament**

The U17's won all their XV's clashes and had a highly successful campaign. Their only loss was in the final of the Bowral 7's when four of the team jumped ship to join their schoolmates at the Liverpool Cougars in the final against the SJRU team. The game was played in great spirit with SJRU going down in a close one.

Particular thanks to manager Rod Dufficy for his work with this team. He helped facilitate one of the largest and most successful Rep campaigns on record.

Apart from the Country clash the U18's had games against

- **Bishop Stortford 1<sup>st</sup> XV**
- **GPS White (3rds)**

The U18's had victories over CJRU U18's and Bishop Stortford 1<sup>st</sup> XV, but for me the highlight was their game against GPS White. The clash against a Representative team from GPS's 1<sup>st</sup> XV players was played in extremely wet conditions on a Thursday night at Boronia Park, Hunters Hill.

The SJRU team eventually lost the game 15-12 but they led for most of the match and apart from a freakish bit of play from the GPS winger, were unlucky not to win the clash. SJRU did have another clash planned (U16, U17 & U18) with Grammar School of Leeds, but unfortunately they pulled out at the last minute.

## NSWJRUI Presidents XV

One of the real highlights of the season was the U16's Presidents XV which played two fixtures against the Bowral Academy side.

The Illawarra U16's competition fell over early in the season and Bowral's U16 team was left stranded with no-one to play. They were still training as a team and very keen to get some rugby to play. As a result we selected a Presidents XV to play the Bowral side in two feature matches at the City v Country and NSW Invitational carnivals.

The Presidents XV was selected from two sources – half from players whom competed at the regionals but were not selected for further honours and half from the U16B grade comp whom had not experienced representative rugby before. Players came from both SJRU and CJRU and we managed to get representation from 25 separate clubs into this side.

The Presidents XV won both these clashes. The first by 40-16, but the second was extremely close with the score 35-33, the lead changed about 4 times in what was a very entertaining festival of rugby.

The feedback from this initiative was enormous with Bowral reporting multiple new registrations to rugby as a result. Good luck for 2016.

## SJRU U17's 7's team

In December 2015 the SJRU U17's 7's side will compete in Wagga Wagga at a national carnival. At the time of writing the selectors have picked a squad which will be reduced to 12 in weeks to come.

## Season Wrap

Despite the various challenges it has been a hugely successful Representative program for 2015. We have had more teams and fixtures than we have had for many years and truly given the club rugby player a valid pathway for the future. The SJRU committee will hold a review in the offseason and as always look to improve our offering for the elite junior rugby player. The committee has worked very hard with our counterparts at Country Junior Rugby in streamlining our pathways and this will continue into 2016. Feedback and constructive criticism is always welcome – but more importantly get involved. The Rep rugby program is only as good as the people involved. Contact your president on how you can help.

Many thanks to Kerry Brady, Tony Fisher, Gary Paton, John Hamilton and Mick Sutherland (CJRU) for their help with this program. Plus thanks once again to all the coaches and managers whom made 2015 a season to remember. And lastly thanks to my wife Bonnie, whom assumed the role of assistant Rep rugby gear steward and storage officer during what she tells me was a long season.
