CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

On behalf of the Sydney Junior Rugby Union (SJRU), thank you to all Clubs and Districts and respective members for their involvement in junior rugby union during the 2017 season.

The SJRU has experienced some significant progress and initiatives during this season and is proud to be focussed on 'growing the game' for our true grassroots community, junior rugby in Sydney.

Strategic Plan

We have developed a Strategic Plan for 2017-2020, with the input of our Board of Directors and the revision of district representatives and club delegates. This highlights the plans for the future of our junior game and the challenges in our sport, met with positive and clear plans for future seasons.

We have identified eight key pillars by which to grow the game of rugby and will, over the next three years endeavour to achieve these outcomes and be guided by this simple strategic vision.

Website

We also launched our website at the beginning of the season, which will continue to be the central resource for all of our 60 Clubs, 12 Districts and over 12,000 players.

This has enabled our clubs, administrators, players, commercial partners and interested parties access to information in an unprecedented central form. There are key resources, calendars, wet weather notifications, ground information, draws and results, club directories for every club, and various updated news flash items throughout the year, keeping our stakeholders up to date in real time.

Registration Day

Our Sydney wide Registration Day at the Sydney Sevens tournament, helped launch the season and registrations for our clubs and give the SJRU a presence at this international event. With significant growth in this form of the game, as well as the festival atmosphere of the world competition, it was a timely introduction to the season with the focus on Sydney and on Rugby Union.

We had television coverage from Fox Sports and exposure for the junior registrations Sydney wide to assist our clubs in obtaining promotion to attract new and retain existing players.

Ambassadors

We have, for the first time, appointed an SJRU Ambassador, Phil Waugh who played 124 Super Rugby matches for the Waratahs, and 79 test caps for the Wallabies. Phil is currently head coach of the touring Mosman Junior Rugby Club U12s and continues to be involved at all levels of the game. He began at Narrabeen, then school years at Shore and through the pathway at Warringah District to the Waratahs and then the Wallabies. He has a strong passion for the game and for the future of the sport, beginning at the very grassroots, and we are honoured to have him involved at the SJRU.

The SJRU appointed Owen Finegan as director of Partnerships. Owen played 93 Super Rugby matches at the Brumbies as flanker or lock and 56 test matches at the Wallabies. Owen maintains a strong connection to the grassroots, coaching all levels of club rugby from his children's village club team the Coogee Seahorses right through to first grade rugby at Randwick. Both Rugby greats are assisting where they can in fostering the growth and development of junior rugby and supporting the grassroots through their active involvement.

Supporters

We have many supporters and partners in this game, with Out and About Media and Marketing producing signage, a media wall and banners for us for both Registration Day and the State Championships. We also have Eratap Beach Resort and Genesis Proprietary Trading partnering with us for the State Championships, and we are very appreciative of the support these partners have shown to grassroots rugby union. Mazda and Spartan have also continued their commercial arrangement with the Sydney Junior Rugby Union.

Registration & Competition

We adopted the national Registration and Competition System in Rugby Link, with the intention of aligning with the national platform utilising this system, as the previous system in 2016 was significantly lacking in capabilities. We are currently reviewing its adequacy and agitating for improvements to this system in 2018 and further plans for the utilisation of a more intuitive system for 2019 and beyond. For 2018, there are key technological developments for a rugby app, where intuitive registration, simplified and automated sign on and photo sheets, live scoring and results, season draws and fixtures and also the administration of the competition will be focussed on with a determination to have employed significant improvements for the coming season.

Participation Numbers

Registration numbers have slightly increased from 2016 to 2017, and with the inclusion of the Sevens numbers, the SJRU has experienced and increase in player numbers in what can be described as a difficult sporting environment for all junior sport due to some general population changes in particular, the number of children involved in organised competitions. With further resources and efforts devoted to recruitment and retention of players, the SJRU plans to increase this further in the coming seasons and improve our junior rugby union participation.

Weight for Age Analysis

With the discussion around Weight for Age, the SJRU initiated the inputting of Weight and Height data being mandatory for all registered players in Rugby Link.

We also took our own data at the State Championships, across every age group for the purposes of analysis of this group of players. This has returned some interesting results, around the 'outliers' for each age group and a debate around all considerations when moving a player up or down an age group as per the new dispensation and Safety guidelines issued by Rugby Australia.

They also conducted a detailed study in the ACT, considering the years of accelerated growth for adolescents, including GPS tracking, measuring speed, impact at the tackle contest, power, and subjective data such as skill and maturity of the player. These results will be used in line with the existing and revised National Safety and Participation Policy, as well as the SJRU State Championship data to address player safety and welfare and have appropriate measures in place. The SJRU will continue to gather important data from our playing group at both Registration and also at successive State Championships, as a means of having accurate data to support outcomes.

Planning and Advisory group

Towards the end of the season, a 2018 Planning and Advisory Group was formed, with two representatives from each district asked to review and recommend key outcomes and amendments for an improved 2018 season.

This collaborative approach, with inclusive and diverse representation, has been productive in influencing change for future seasons. The group was formed to openly discuss what is great about junior rugby, what requires work and what needs change. The group has worked collaboratively on influencing issues and provided a voice for their clubs and districts. The representatives volunteered further time to the game to influence discussions around the registration and competition system, regrading, dispensations, the import rule, season draw, the SJRU strategic plan, match officials, weight for age, medical concussion blue card, general player welfare and safety, grassroots development plan, representative rugby, recruitment, retention, and promotion of junior rugby union.

The discussions were robust and productive. The Planning Advisory Group will continue to meet monthly during the 2018 season in a combined effort to improve our game.

Stakeholders

We initiated some further consultation with our stakeholders, and organised meetings with our Western Clubs to determine how we can effectively assist in growing the game in the west and listen to what are the main challenges facing the western districts, some of which are geographically pertinent. This was well received and began discussions and planning with the purpose of supporting a growing demographic in engaging in rugby union. These discussions and the implementation of some relevant initiatives will continue during 2018. The SJRU in conjunction with NSW RU, offered the Waratahs Way program to these clubs as a priority, to develop and engage coaching volunteers, arming them with some important tools to develop their junior players. It was met with great enthusiasm, and then we offered the same program to all of our clubs over the ensuing weeks, with most clubs agreeing to utilise the opportunity, offered at no cost to Clubs. We will continue to roll out the Waratahs Way during 2018 for those clubs who have not yet engaged in the valuable program.

District meetings

We also held a District Presidents meeting in an effort to discuss specific Districts and obtain input from all Districts as central representatives of our clubs. This consultation will continue for 2018 with a focus on District representatives and enabling Districts to be involved in being more than a representative rugby body, or managing minis rugby, but engaging their clubs centrally and being actively involved with the Sydney Junior Rugby Union.

Women in rugby

The SJRU hosted our inaugural 'Women in Rugby' luncheon as a tribute to the women who volunteer in our clubs. The Wallaroos and Josephine Sukkar (Australian Womens' Rugby President) sent a genuine message of thanks to the women in rugby, with a sentiment that all women at all levels of the game contribute to the whole, and we thank you.

Digital media

Our digital footprint with the launch of the SJRU Social Facebook Group, has enabled clubs to share information and initiatives, and communicate in an unprecedented way. We currently have 4,280 followers and growing.

We now have a thriving sevens competition, and enabled new competitions and pathways for the girls, both key growth areas of the game.

We plan to continue to grow the shortened form of the game for juniors and provide further opportunities for girls to play rugby.

Competition Management

The management of the competition and all the support behind the scenes to allow our almost 12,000 players to enjoy weekly rugby union right across Sydney is valued.

Susan Stenning, the competition assistant, thank you for your commitment to the game, often behind the scenes.

Kerry Brady, the Competition Manager for the Sydney Junior Rugby Union for the past five years, is moving on to Premiership Rugby for 2018 and beyond. We wish Kerry well in her new pursuits and thank her sincerely for her energy and devotion to junior rugby union over the years.

Thank you to all the Board of Directors for their involvement and time commitment to our sport over this season. Some Directors will not nominate for a Board position for 2018, so I would like to thank them for their time on the Board during my tenure in 2017. Namely, Ross Mottershead, Robert Martin, Nicole Williamson and Sarah Mullette.

In Summary

Thank you also to each of the 12 District Presidents, and each of the 60 Club Presidents, for the significant amount of time and energy and enthusiasm you provide to your communities. It is not unnoticed, it is appreciated and you are key to assisting us grow the game.

To all the volunteers, the parents and the players that enjoy this great sport and have the associated passion for the game, thank you.

Rugby Union is a combative, skilful and truly international game and we look forward to working with our Clubs in further assisting where we can in developing all aspects of grassroots club rugby.

We will continue to improve the delivery of the competition, making it safe, inclusive and fair for all participants.

Thank you for your involvement and see you for an even more enjoyable 2018 season.

COMPETITION REPORT

Once again the season concluded with a very successful Grand Final weekend with over 40 Cup Grand Finals and 16 Plate Finals being played at 8 venues. Many thanks must go to the Clubs hosting the Finals series.

This years competitions saw a comparable number of teams to previous years with over 360 teams commencing the season in April. However by August this number was reduced to 352. This occurs naturally each year with joint ventures being formed and teams with small player numbers not being sustainable during a long season.

Player numbers remain steady around the 12,000 with the U10-U12 age groups being the most numerous. Once high school commences our player numbers decrease. Minis numbers this year were very healthy which bodes well for the future.

2017 saw Sydney Juniors utilize the Rugby Link system for registrations and competition management. This system is supplied by the ARU and enabled on line payments for registration to be deposited in Club bank accounts very quickly. With the introduction of the National Participation Fee (NPL) and National Insurance levy (NIL) Clubs had to be aware of these payments when setting their own registration fees. Those Clubs who utilized on line payments would have been able to manage their cash flows more easily as their payments to NSWRU and SJRU were sent directly without the Club being invoiced. For 2018 the ARU and NSWRU is strongly encouraging all Clubs to utilize on line payment to lighten the workload of volunteers and Club Committees. As the system was new for Sydney Juniors many registrars took advantage of the face to face sessions offered by both the ARU staff and Susan and myself. Thanks go to those who attended these and got a good start on registrations and understanding of the new system. But as with any system the limitations became apparent with the quirks of the Sydney Junior competition. The ladders system was unable to cope with our regrading process and ladders had to be kept manually and published separately. Much appreciation goes to Sarah Mullette, Competition Age Coordinator U10-U12 and Tricia Waters, Age Coordinator U13s-Opens who created the updates and navigated the back end of the Rugby Link system to provide us with tables correct post regrading. They also met regularly and furnished extremely helpful reports with data extracted from Rugby Link to both myself and the Board.

We have been heavily involved throughout the year with both the ARU and the company providing Rugby Link to ensure that enhancements are made for 2018 and the workload on volunteers is reduced with the expected provision of a scoring and sign on app. Fingers crossed this will be available for February.

The first grading meeting held this year at NSW Waratahs was a huge success with all in attendance reaching agreement and also instituting a type of geographical split for the U10s. This was to alleviate travel for the first year out of Minis and hopefully encourage more parents to register for Rugby at the U10s age group for 2018. The regrading meeting held at North Ryde RSL prior to round 4 was of mixed success due to issues raised in the U13s age group. This age group has been problematic all season and the impact of disparate player size was felt most keenly in this year group.

I was fortunate to have been invited during the year to attend the National Safety meetings and be privy to the on going research being done as regards weight/age rugby. However I should caution all Clubs that there is no easy solution. It must be remembered that New Zealand does NOT have weight/age Rugby throughout the country and that according to all available research age is still the best determinant to ensure players play at appropriate levels. The ARU this year also instituted a new Safety Policy which enabled Competition Managers, with appropriate assessments being carried out, to move players up or down from their requisite age groups. This policy will be further enhanced for 2018 with the likelihood of maximum and minimum weights/heights triggering an automatic assessment. The ARU via Rugby Link will mandate the provision of weight and height nationally at registration for 2018.

Clubs must also realise that whilst some players may be forced up an age group others may also be forced down. However many parents will need to understand that sometimes safety will determine where their child should play and not their friendship groups. Fortunately Sydney Juniors having graded competitions should see minimal forced transfers. The National Safety Committee and the ARU has also been instrumental with recommending much of the enhanced reporting and protocols regarding concussion which has ensured that Rugby Union remains an extremely safe sport for participants. Further enhancements as regards reporting of injuries will be forthcoming next season.

During 2017 a planning and advisory group met regularly to discuss issues relating to the competition and to make suggestions for improvement in 2018. It is envisaged that this discussion group will reconvene in 2018 and that the new Competition Manager and SJRU Administrator will be invited to attend and contribute.

Once again the Junior March Past was a highlight of the season with increased numbers attending at Allianz Stadium. The cooperation of all who attended was very much appreciated and this great event will once again be held in 2018 prior to the Waratahs Vs Highlanders game in May. Similarly the cooperation and enthusiasm of the Community Rugby staff was very much evident during the year with many Clubs taking advantage of the excellent Waratahs way program. This is a non accreditation program which allows Clubs or groups of Clubs to have specific topics presented to their coaches at a training evening. The Community Rugby staff, led by Andrew Hill are always available to help Clubs and they are trying very hard to increase the conversion rates from the Game On program to Junior Club Rugby.

Looking back over past annual reports the common theme appears to be issues with coaching and the "win at all costs" attitude of many coaches. Unfortunately 2017 saw no great improvement in this sphere and once again Club committees are strongly urged to review the attitudes and expectations of their coaches...the vast majority of players are there for enjoyment and not for higher honours...we must cater to all but remember that kids play mainly for enjoyment...the Pathway method for U10s-U12s stresses this aspect and tries to enable all to have a positive experience. The suggestion that all players in those age groups should have equal playing time is one which may need to be incorporated into Competition rules.

Girls Rugby and Sevens goes from strength to strength and much of this is due to the enormous amount of work put in by Tony Cooper (Director of Girls Rugby and 7s). The SJRU Sizzling 7s was conducted on Saturday evenings in 3 waves during the year and saw a huge increase in the number of participants. This necessitated extra organization and coordination and was conducted in the main by Bippy Power and by the NSW Development Officer Caitlin Aquilina. Thanks must also go to the various Clubs who hosted with most Saturdays seeing 2 venues being run simultaneously. It is expected that 2018 will see another increase in this competition and we would welcome other Clubs getting involved in the planning and execution of this growing facet of the game.

As a consequence of the increased numbers of girls playing, SJRU was able to select a Girls U17 XV team to play Country at the annual City Country fixture. Whilst Country ran out the winners in this inaugural fixture the enthusiasm and talent is certainly present to ensure this game is played every year and be even extended to include another age group.

The Representative program once again saw Zone and Sydney teams selected mainly from the State and Regional Championships and fixtures played against Country and even against school rep teams in the case of the SJRU U18s. Congratulations must go to all connected with the Representative teams and to Robert Martin (Director Representatives) for the coordination and oversight.

Another issue that seems to be of perpetual concern is spectator behavior or rather poor spectator behavior. The introduction of team Ground Marshalls, clearly identified in high vis bibs has been a success

The accessibility of this excellent course and other resources in the ARU Learning Centre will be improved with a change to the sign on process... there will be no excuse for Ground Marshalls, Assistant referees and other Club personnel not taking advantage of the courses available.

Each year we encourage Clubs to provide not only assistant referees but to encourage parents and older players to become referees. It is becoming extremely difficult to source and retain referees especially young referees when spectator behavior is poor.

This also makes the task of referee appointments extremely difficult and credit must be given to Stuart Wright who took over from Luke Rogan. Stuart has had a baptism of fire this season and hopefully all Clubs will appreciate the enormous effort he has expended trying to ensure that all fixtures were covered.

Fortunately this year the load on our Judiciary has been lightened by a reduction in red cards. This resulted in fewer Wednesday evening Judiciaries! Thanks must go to Mark Ashurst and Dougal Geddes for their oversight of judicial proceedings and to Andrew Hourigan, Tina Brunton, Cameron Player, Nick Garling and Chris Shaw for their availability and assistance with Judicial hearings.

The successful Trytons program for special needs children was once again well supported by SJRU and thanks must go to Mark Green for his coordination of this and to both Lindfield Junior Rugby and Randwick Junior Rugby for providing a venue for each Saturday and Sunday morning.

Unfortunately for many Clubs the provision of First aid attendants via Sydney Juniors will not occur in 2018. The 32 Clubs who have contributed to this scheme and who have had their attendants provided for home games have been advised that as the coordinator of this scheme has decided not to continue in 2018 SJRU has had no option but to cease this service. The extra workload on the SJRU especially on Susan was enormous and to add appointments and sourcing of attendants to this was deemed impossible. At one stage during the year SJRU had over 65 "employees" with all the attendant legislative and bureaucratic requirements this entailed adding an enormous amount of work. To assist Clubs I have requested that the SJRU facilitate a First Aid course and that contact details of attendants be supplied to those Clubs who availed themselves of the SJRU service this year.

As many are aware the SJRU will have a new Competition Manager for 2018. I have been very fortunate over the past four and a half years to

have developed some wonderful relationships with Club committees and SJRU Board members. The cooperation and assistance that I have received during that time has made the job so much easier and extremely satisfying. I will certainly miss those interactions and I hope that the same consideration and help will be given to the new appointee. To the various Presidents and contacts who have acted as sounding boards when I have had queries and problems or have sought advice I owe you much gratitude. Sydney Juniors is very fortunate to have such a diverse and enthusiastic group of volunteers who willingly share their time and knowledge for the good of others.

A competition as diverse and challenging as the Sydney Juniors one would not be as successful without the support of the Board and its Chair. I thank Katrina Oxenham and all those on both the present Board and the past for their help and advice. The workload of the position is enormous and very time consuming but is certainly lightened when every one pitches in and assists.

The Competition department of NSW Rugby is extremely small and everyone works together to ensure the various comps run smoothly. The NSW Rugby staff of Tim Richards and Mark Green have been instrumental in ensuring that correct procedures have been followed and that the day to day running of the competition has been facilitated and that all necessary governance requirements have been adhered to. Susan Stenning, appointed in 2016 has done an enormous amount of work this year and although only employed 3 days a week has willingly completed tasks and been available to assist with everything at other times. She has attended the Sizzling 7s and helped coordinate venues and is always willing to assist volunteers at the various Clubs outside her normal work hours.

I wish Sydney Juniors the very best for 2018 and urge all Club Committees to remember that the competition is your competition and is only successful when everyone contributes and attends the various meetings and ensures that all voices are heard and listened to.

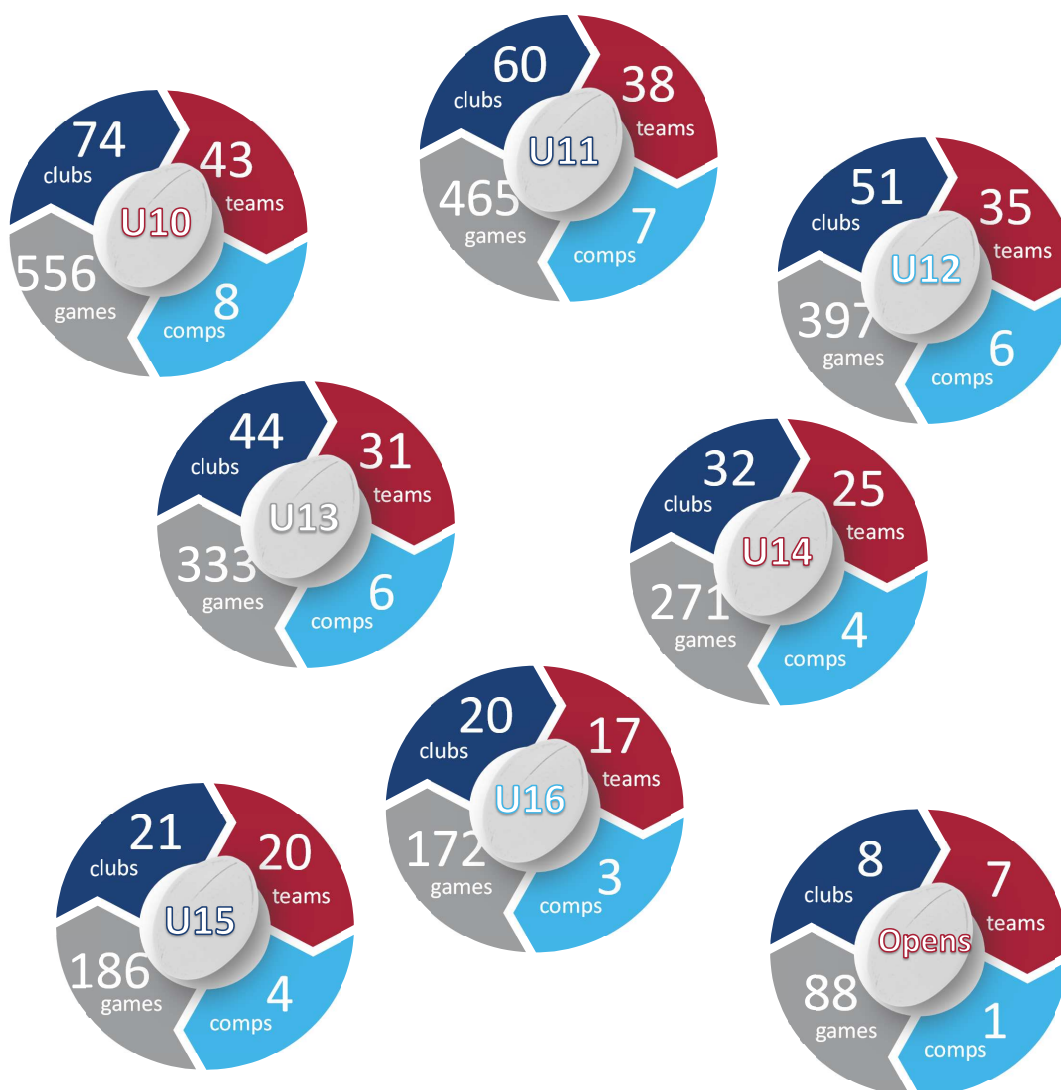

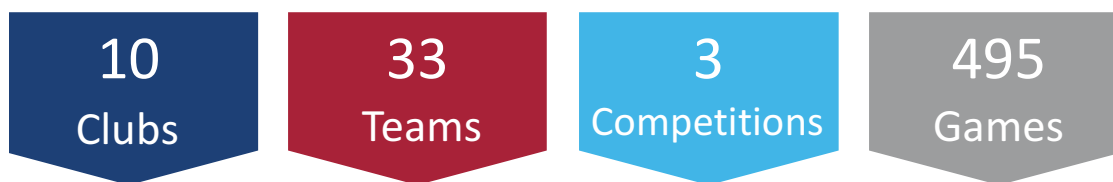

MINIS REPORT

2017 saw the continuation of a strong, vibrant series of Minis competitions run across Sydney by local district organisations. As has been the case in recent years, there were seven Minis competitions run in Sydney – Southern Districts, Randwick/Eastern Suburbs, Inner West, Western Sydney, Eastwood, Gordon/Norths and Northern Beaches.

SJRU's role is to support these local competitions and I would like to thank and pay tribute to the District Minis Coordinators who put in so much time and effort to support Minis rugby in their local community. Similarly there are hard-working Minis Coordinators, Coaches, Managers, parents and of course all the players at clubs across Sydney who all contribute to the fun and engagement of Minis rugby in Sydney, and we are very grateful for all of their efforts. Referees are an essential part of rugby and we are also indebted to them for the great contribution they make, especially as happens in Minis where many new young referees learn the art of whistle-blowing.

Overall many clubs reported that numbers of players were slightly down, although many were steady and some clubs grew. This may have been partly due to a very wet start to the season making it hard to train and recruit, but the downward trend is a concern for all clubs.

Each local competition is structured in the way that suits their clubs. Formats vary with competitions organised at a central venue, at a rotating venue, on a home/away basis, all of an age group playing at the same location or vertical streams playing at the same venue. Some districts experienced frustration with being able to finalise their draw early in the season but will be applying lessons from that in preparing their 2018 draw.

Girls made up a small but growing proportion of Minis players in 2017, a trend that most clubs are keen to encourage. In Under 6s and 7s many clubs had girls playing alongside boys, with Dee Why continuing to field girl-only teams in both age groups in the Northern Beaches competition. The Warringah clubs started a separate girls Under 8/9 competition with up to 50 girls from four clubs (Dee Why, Collaroy, Narrabeen and Newport) making up teams. This was a great credit to those clubs and also Stephen Comber, the Warringah Girls' Coordinator. Gordon/Norths attempted to establish a girls only competition but couldn't find enough numbers to make it work.

In 2017 we attempted for the first time to run an inter-district Minis gala day, where clubs across Sydney would host Minis teams from clubs outside the district they normally play in. The purpose of this was to allow Minis to play different teams but also for every Minis player to experience the fun and excitement of a gala day atmosphere. Unfortunately the logistics of this proved too challenging but preliminary planning for 2018 has already commenced.

Otherwise the number of invitational gala days for Minis has been growing, some with Finals and some just for fun. These are significant events and we are grateful to the host clubs for their efforts in supporting the spirit of Minis rugby. This year we saw:

- King of the Hills (Under 8s and Under 9s)
- Harbord Harlequins Cup (Under 8s and Under 9s)
- Chatswood Challenge Cup (Under 8s and Under 9s)
- Dufficy Cup (Under 9s – Hunters Hill)
- Randwick Gala Day (Under 6, 7s, 8s and 9s)
- Tiger Cup (Under 6s and Under 7s – Wahroonga)

Overall Minis rugby is alive and well in Sydney. There are thousands of players, officials, parents and supporters cheering on their team each weekend. The spirit of rugby is reflected best in seeing a bright-eyed Under 6 player get the ball in her hands and run for the corner. The more we can support and encourage these players and their helpers, the better will be the future of our game.

SEVENS AND GIRLS RUGBY

In 2017 Sydney Juniors had over 800 girls and boys comprising some 45 teams involved in regular structured Rugby 7s competition across the Sydney basin.

We started the season off in February (Term 1) with Wave 1 of Sizzling Sevens, up at Koola Park kindly hosted by the Lindfield Club with a seven week program for both girls and boys commencing a couple of weeks after the hype of the IRB Sydney 7s. This was the first time we had offered boys the opportunity to participate in a structured 7s competition and it proved a success as a precursor for boys to the regular XVs winter season. The major success was however the continued growth in girl's participation in rugby sevens as a sport.

In 2017 we decided to extend the age group brackets involved based on stakeholder feedback to include boys and girls in both Under 10s and Under 12s. This was in addition to the previous offerings in ages Under 14s, Under 16s and Under 18s.

Wave 1 was significantly hampered by unseasonal weather conditions (rain, hail and horrific high temperatures) that forced us to either cancel entire weekend events or numerous games as a result.

In Term 2 we kicked off Wave 2 of Saturday Night Sizzling 7s as a girls only 7s competition. This wave saw numerous SJRU Village Clubs host games across the Sydney basin. It became apparent however that due to our success that venue selection with sufficient ground space would be a key ingredient to avoid scheduling challenges. This resulted in us trialling a Zone configured competition in Wave 3 which had Western Zone and Northern Zone teams group together with South East Magic from the Southern Zone and teams from outside the Sydney basin (i.e. Central Coast and Warrernvale)

switching between zone competitions. The only venue that could host the entire group in Wave 3 was West Juniors at St Lukes Concord in weeks 2 and 6.

Once again we offered Village Club teams involved in Sizzling 7s the opportunity to play off in a competition structure to be crowned 7s Champions in overall age group brackets. Structured 7s competition formats have also been successful in helping girls and boys hone their skills and build confidence in contact. This approach was also evident by the number of boys and girls teams wishing to compete in the 2017 NSW Rugby 7s State Championships, held in October up in Coffs Harbour for age brackets Under 13s and Under 15s and then in Sydney for Under 17s.

Congratulations to all the players, teams, village club administrators/ volunteers and referees that made for a successful 2017 Rugby 7s season and in particular the back of house support from Caitlin Aquilina, Bippy Power, Nicole Williamson, Susan Stenning, Kerry Brady and Andrew Hill for all their efforts and energy in supporting the growth of 7s.
