CHAIR'S REPORT

George Roper, SJRU Chairman

After the last two years of Covid interruptions it was extremely pleasing to get a full season of junior rugby in Sydney during 2022.

The year in review started with the 2021 Spring sevens competition which saw a record number of teams participating for Boys and Girls sevens, because of players wanting to get back into junior rugby after the Covid interruptions. This was followed by a successful Sizzling sevens competition, that was hosted at the start of the 2022 calendar year.

The weather patterns experienced in Sydney in 2022 made for a wet and muddy winter season, and provided some challenges with ground availability, but thanks to the efforts of our Competition Management Team only one round was treated as washed out for most age groups. SJRU again offered a Friday night XV's competition for U10 to U12 and a Sunday XV's competition for U10 to Opens. The Sunday XV's competition commenced with two gala rounds played on 27 March and 3 April. These gala days were unfortunately impacted by field closures due to rain, but most teams still played in at least one gala round. These games provided valuable insight to aid in competition grading. The SJRU also put in a huge effort to measure heights and weights of players at these gala days in accordance with the Rugby Australia Size for Age policy.



In 2022 SJRU introduced a new girls academy to promote 15's rugby for U14 to U18 girls, which saw more than 150 girls register. For younger age groups a new Tri-series event was created for U11 and U13 girls.

It has been amazing to see how much effort so many people have put in to promote Junior Rugby across Sydney. I would like to acknowledge and thank everyone that contributed to a hugely successful year for the Sydney Junior Rugby Union. A special thank you to the following people and organizations:

- the SJRU Competition Management team lead by our SJRU General Manager, Ben Gregory, as well as John Glen and Bippy Power, for their outstanding efforts throughout the year.
- Mark Green, the General Manager NSW Community Rugby for all his support and assistance.
- All the SJRU Directors for their support and contributions to governance, oversight and strategic direction at the SJRU.
- Thank you to our SJRU Sponsors: The Rugby Club Foundation, Maqro, Elmo Software & BondIQ
- All the SJRU affiliated Clubs and Districts and their respective committees.
- Thank you to all our referees for the, often thankless, task that they perform at all our fixtures, without them there can be no games.

- thank you to each and every rugby club volunteer that assists with getting our junior players on the field every weekend. This includes coaches, managers, ground marshals, AR's etc.

One of the highlights in 2022 was the introduction of the Maqro Sydney Cup, which was contested by all SJRU Districts at the State Champs for under 14's and older age groups. There have been some learnings from the format, but the concept was very well received and will be continued in future years.

Congratulations to all the boys and girls that were selected in SJRU representative teams this year. Our SJRU teams made us proud at the annual City vs Country Carnival that was held in Bathurst at the end of July. In this year we also reintroduced the fixtures between Sydney Juniors and Brisbane Juniors. In September our Sydney u14 Girls and Boys and u16 Girls teams visited Brisbane to play against the Brisbane Juniors teams. All three our Sydney teams came home with very comprehensive wins.

Although the SJRU competitions officially start at under 10 age groups, during 2022 we have identified the targeted growth of minis players as one of our main strategic objectives. There has been a recent decline in minis player numbers across Sydney. Although this trend is in line with most organized junior sports, post covid, the SJRU acknowledges that the minis are our future junior players and will therefore look to increase support for clubs and districts to attract minis players to our great game of rugby union. In addition to our annual inter district minis gala day, next year the SJRU will host minis gala days across Sydney on the last weekend of every month during the rugby season.

During the 2022 XV's season we were faced with some referee shortages, which were exacerbated by last minute game changes because of inclement weather. The SJRU is allocating resources and working with the various referee associations to actively address this for next season.

A major rugby community highlight in 2022, was Australia being confirmed as hosts for the Rugby World Cup for Men in 2027 and the Rugby World Cup for Women in 2029. This means that some of our boys and girls currently playing in SJRU competitions can aspire to represent the Wallabies and Wallaroos at a Rugby World Cup on home soil in a few years' time. These events will also have massive impacts on the growth of our game in Sydney.

Finally, I would like to thank each and every junior player and parent for supporting our SJRU affiliated clubs over the last year. Thank you for your contribution to making Junior Rugby Union in Sydney a unique and special sporting community.



COMPETITION REPORT

Ben Gregory, General Manager SJRU

We're Back! In many ways 2022 was a year like no other – but considering the previous two 'Covid' seasons I think it also felt somewhat normal.

We began the year with Sizzling 7s and despite a strong uptake in the Girl's Sizzling 7s, the nominations of teams for the Boy's Sizzling wave was not nearly as strong as anticipated. The mid-year survey showed that the clubs as a majority were keen to have some clean air for their pre-season preparations and would only like one or two gala style events in late Feb. The girls on the other hand wanted Sizzling to start in March and not earlier. The 2022 Sizzling wave went right up till the end of March for the boys and into early April for the Girls.

We also changed up the registration offering in 2022 so that boys and girls could register for all the 7s waves in one registration type. This was well received.

The end of March saw the competitions start with our Friday Only Comp kicking off on the same weekend as the first Grading Gala for the Fri-Sun Comp (aka the Sunday Comp). Unfortunately, we lost quite a few grounds to wet weather over the two Grading weekends – nearly all teams got at least two grading games to give us some date (except the lower grade U13s whom missed out completely). This impacted our ability to grade the competitions correctly and thus we were still regrading up until round 5.

We did hit one of our main goals for the year though and got the draw out early to clubs. It wasn't quite as envisaged as wet weather dogged us for much of the year, but all in all we had the draw out weeks in advance so teams could plan. The fall of Easter in 2023 gives us a nice window to do the initial draw and then ideally have grading completed by round 3 and a season draw out to the clubs.

The Friday Only comp in 2022 only had an U10 and U11 age group as we didn't get the uptake for U12s with only 5 teams nominating – these teams moved to the Fri-Sun Comp. Both competitions were un-graded, and we fielded 8 teams in the U10 and 10 teams in the U12. We did lose quite a few games early season to the weather as a number of these clubs simply could not get onto their fields.

The Friday-Sunday Competition saw an increase in the number of older boys' teams playing this season. We managed to field two grades in the Opens competition but had to run



combined AB competitions in some age groups due to the ratio of strength amongst the teams. Our U10 to U12 ages saw a rise in the number of teams choosing to play home games on a Friday night, but geographics curtailed this option somewhat.

Despite the wet weather we only actually lost half a round to washed out games throughout the season. Our Grand final days were spectacular with fantastic weather to boot.

For our Girls the 'winter season' saw them partake in the XV's wave during May and June followed by the Frosty 7s Wave in July & August. Both these were competition waves with finals, and these gave us some good learnings during the year as to which day and format we should be running the girls during winter. Constant clashes (and therefore late withdrawals/forfeits) with other sports or school sports on the Saturday became an issue, as well as the lack of resources on a Saturday afternoon – when every other rugby fixture is also taking place. We will look to integrate these Girls waves into our Sunday offering in 2023. Especially for our XV's which will move down to U12 and be extended through to end of June.

Spring 7s gave us the opportunity to test the new format options with games moving to Sunday and in a fortnightly gala format. Feedback has been excellent as the teams appreciate more games on the same day, negating travel issues for only a couple of games, but also allowing teams to have a weekend off with no impact to other teams or competitions.

The 2022 season gave SJRU the opportunity to implement several new strategic measures designed to expand and improve our offering. These include;

- **SJRU Rugby 1st Girls Academy** – This was a designated Girls only Academy which was aimed to offer our girls and coaches some exposure to some high-performance training and techniques. Supported by SJRU as well as Rugby AU (Nathan McMahon) and NSWRU (Brit Merlo) we saw several high-profile coaches including Jay Tregonning and Campbell Aitken deliver sessions. Rugby 1st and Harvey Norman were fantastic sponsors of this program.
- **SJRU U12 Development Gala** – Having lost two years to Covid the current Under 12 age group completely missed the NSWJRU U10 & U11 State Gala. So effectively with the Under 12 age group reverting to a single team there were many players who missed the opportunity to experience Rep rugby. SJRU implemented a Development Gala specifically for players that didn't attend the State Champs and it was a smashing success. We will repeat in 2023 and add a Girls U12 Development Gala too.
- **ELMO SJRU Club Championships** – The Club Champs model was designed by our GM and sponsored by ELMO. It involved a mathematical formula that multiplied competition points by a 'Grade' multiplier and then divided by the number of teams. It was run as a Big Club (6 teams or more) and a Small Club (5 teams or less) Championship. Oatley won the Big Club and Blacktown the Small Club Champs.



- **SJRU vs BJRU Rep fixtures** – Through our relationship with BJRU, we re-established the traditional fixtures between SJRU and BJRU for our Sydney U14 Boys and Girls teams as well as our U16 Girls team. Sydney teams flew to Brisbane in September for a day trip and were successful in claiming all three fixtures. We will welcome BJRU down to Sydney next September for the same.
- **SJRU Girls Tri-Series** – To fill what was a void in the calendar for the U11 and U13 girls, SJRU created the Tri-Series which was a series of three gala events for these girls to try a slightly bigger format of the game in 10 aside. Running into the evening using the Dufficy Cup format it was a great initiation into the bigger format of the game. As a result, SJRU will look to run a proper 8 week U12 Girls competition in 2023 (10 per side).
- **Sydney Cups** – A new initiative that has been a decade in the making. It is part of the NSWJRU State Champs but gives the Sydney Districts a competition to rival the Country Champs that CRU has run for many years.

Add to all this our work on Minis engagement strategies, Monthly Minis Inter-District Galas and other events like Pasifica Youth Cup, the SJRU team is certainly busy trying to make sure rugby has something for everyone. We are also actively working on strategies to grow our referees and coaches via various scholarship programs that are supported by our friends at The Rugby Club Foundation.



None of what we do can be done without our fantastic sponsors. A massive thanks to Wahu (Elle), Maqro (Conrad and Mark), ELMO (James), BondiQ (Gavin), Rugby 1st (Angus and Alex), Harvey Norman (Samantha), The Rugby Club Foundation (Angus, Lisa & Board)

I'd like to thank the Competition Team for all their hard work this season. John Glen (Youth Manager), Bippy Power (7s Competitions), Andrew Hutton (Draw Contractor + Pres NSWJRU) and Shane Williams (Asst Comp liaison). It has certainly been a big year for us all. As it has been for Hamish McKay who handled referee appointments once Todd Cummins stepped down – certainly was a baptism of fire for Hamish with the first Gala round in March.

Unfortunately, it is not always smooth sailing, and we sometimes need to call in our judicial panel, a big thanks to Andrew Hourigan, Grant Whatley, Anthony 'Marvin' Hunt and Linda Hutton for their services to our judiciary.

The Comp team would like to also thank Chairman George Roper and the SJRU Board for their support and considered opinion. The strategic views coming from the Board will certainly yield fruit over the next few years.



Lastly a big thanks to all the Club and District Presidents and officials for their support over the season. It is certainly a hard job at the coalface and whilst we may not always agree on certain issues, we share your passion for growing our game (and your clubs) and appreciate all your hard work this year.

NORTHERN ZONE REPORT

After two COVID-disrupted seasons, 2022 kicked off with Sizzling 7s. La Nina and constant wet weather caused numerous challenges, wash outs and disrupted the early season, especially grading.

The All-Clubs meeting was held in March, followed by a Northern Zone Coaches and Managers briefing hosted by Wahroonga. Both events were well attended and helped ensure the competition rule changes and our first use of gala grading rounds was well understood.

Our Gala rounds were cut back to one week for most age groups, and the impacts were felt during early rounds with re-grading of teams required. As our season got back on track, Districts prepared for the return of NSW State Championships. These events were stunning successes, with Northern Zone Districts performing well. Manly were joint U12 winners, Gordon winners in U15s and Manly took out the Girls U14s. Manly U16s won the inaugural Sydney Cup before falling to Randwick in the State Championship Final.

A significant number of players were chosen for higher honours, with strong representation from all four Northern Zone Districts in the Sydney and NSW teams.

In August, a Northern Zone Presidents meeting was held to begin the process of looking at the future of our game in our zone. We examined falling participation rates, especially in Mini's and mapped several actions to address and improve.

The season is wrapping up with Spring 7s, and again Northern Zone clubs are dominating total participation and hosting duties leading to shorter travel times for many teams.

2023 planning is underway, and we look forward to learning from the experiences of 2022 with grading and gala rounds, and an improved competition in 2023.



SOUTHERN ZONE REPORT

Congratulations to all the teams, we FINALLY had a whole season with no lockdown, apart from the weather conditions with plenty of RAIN which resulted in a lot of washed-out games. This year was my first year as the Southern Zone Director and during the year I have built some great relationships with most of the Southern Zone Junior Clubs.

2022 Southern Zone Clubs, as all zones, were in a rebuilding phase with many junior clubs struggling to have MINIS registering teams. It shows the last 2 years of little rugby effected our Minis dramatically. To counter this, we are fighting back with our Super Minis coming up in November and kicking off our 2023 season with an end of each month Minis Gala where all teams have been invited to run a BIG SHOW for our existing and NEWCOMERS.

Southern Zone Forum: at the end of the season, we held a forum for all junior club / districts presidents from southern zone to discuss how they went this year. Some comments:

- Minis numbers dropped
- Needing more Volunteers & Referees
- Junior Clubs Connecting with Schools
- Getting our senior district club involved with junior clubs.
- Running an end of year academy for each district to keep the kids engaged with rugby during summer season. Like what Randwick Junior are doing.
- Keep building on coaching development.

This year Randwick Junior run a referee course for 20 youth kids from the area to referee Friday games for their local area. We also had 40+ Coaches from East Besties do a Mini coach the coach course run by NSW RU to help NEW coaches to get developed.

The Southern Zone held its first U16s Boys State Champ for XVs Comp at Riverwood Park, hosted by Oatley Rugby Club during June Long weekend. It was great results for all districts & zone taking part in competition.

Last year's director Nicole recommended an increased social media exposure. This year we have achieved that; including having our first Girls Academy to gain increased participation for XVs rugby.

I will be stepping down at the end of the year as SJRU Southern Zone Director, but I'll still be around the rugby fields and will still be working at NSW Rugby, developing rugby with our Junior Clubs & Schools. I have really enjoyed being the director for this zone and would like to thank everyone who made this possible for their time and assistance this year. Thank you to my fellow directors for your support. I leave knowing that rugby will continue to grow as a game not only in this district but in all of Sydney.



MINIS REPORT

2022 saw the continuation of a vibrant series of Minis competitions run across Sydney by local district organisations. As has been the case in recent years, there were seven Minis competitions run in Sydney – Southern Districts, Randwick/Eastern Suburbs, Inner West, Western Sydney, Eastwood, Gordon/Norths and Northern Beaches.

The role of the SJRU is to support these local competitions and I would like to thank and pay tribute to the District Minis Coordinators who put in so much time and effort to support Minis Rugby in their local community.

Similarly, there are hard-working Club Minis Coordinators, Coaches, Managers, parents and of course all the players at clubs across Sydney who all contribute to the fun and engagement of Minis rugby in Sydney, and we are very grateful for all their efforts.

Referees are an essential part of rugby, and we are also indebted to them for the great contribution they make. Minis rugby is one of the great training grounds for new young referees to learn the art of whistleblowing.

Each of the Mini's competitions is structured in a way that suits the clubs of that district. Formats vary with competitions organised at a central venue, at a rotating venue, on a home/away basis, all age groups playing at the same location or vertical streams playing at the same venue.



In 2022 the SJRU welcomed back the Inter-District Minis Gala Day. Participation was optional but pleasingly nearly every club in Sydney joined in. On June 18th at 7 different venues across Sydney, host clubs welcomed minis teams from outside their district for a non-competitive rugby gala day, playing some 389 games between them. BBQs blazed across all venues and the smiles could not be contained as the visiting Waratahs posed for hundreds of photos and signed too many boots to count.

This was a significant event on the SJRU calendar with lots of planning and organisation required. Congratulations to the District Minis Coordinators, Host Clubs, Travelling Clubs, Referees, parents and especially the players for the wonderful spirit they all showed in making this a fun and memorable occasion. We have already begun planning for the 2023 gala day!

There were also several invitational gala days for minis planned to run across Sydney, some being competitive and some just for fun. These are significant events, and we look forward to them continuing and thank in advance the host clubs for their efforts in supporting the spirit of Minis rugby.

- Harbord Harlequins Cup (Under 8s and Under 9s)
- Chatswood Challenge Cup (Under 8s and Under 9s)
- Dufficy Cup (Under 9s – Hunters Hill)

- Tiger Cup (Under 6s and Under 7s –Wahroonga)

A significant decrease in participation numbers over the last two years due to Covid has led many discussions on the growth of Minis rugby in Sydney. There are several major Try Rugby events set up for late 2022 in collaboration with NSW Rugby to increase recruitment and aid retention. The more we can support and encourage our players to bring a friend along the better the future of our game will be.

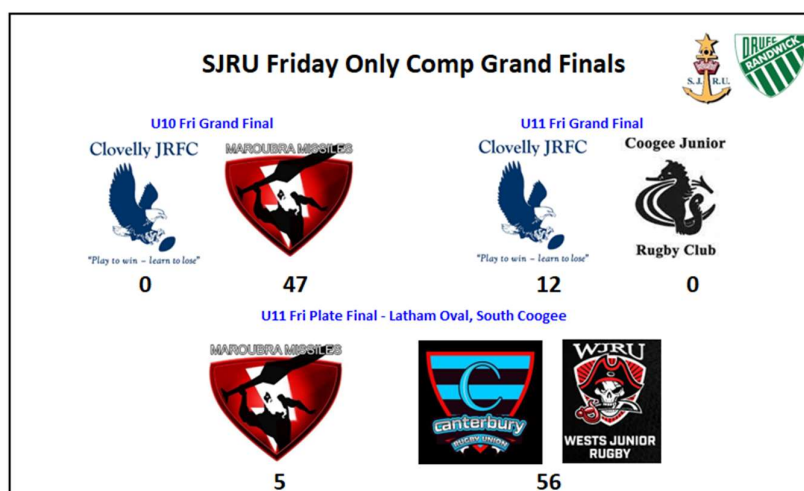
FRIDAY COMPETITION

This year was finally the time we were all able to get back into rugby after Covid and it has been a big year even though the weather was challenging in the beginning.

There were many 'firsts' this year with the Girls Rugby

- Welcoming Bippy Power (7s Competitions) taking over Tina Campbell from 2021
- Welcoming Shane Williams (Asst Comp liaison)
- Introduction of a yearly registration fee for the Girls to cover all Waves during the Season but still the option of registering individually for each Wave. It was so much easier and cheaper for the parents to pay the yearly registration
- SJRU Rugby 1st Girls Academy – as per GM's report it was a Girls only Academy designed to offer our girls and coaches to high-performance training and techniques. This sponsored event was a success, and it was also a great opportunity for girls to upskill for free! Girls were given t shirts that looked great.
- State Champs XV Girls – Introduction of Sydney Cup – battle between the State Champs teams from Sydney exposed great games from the girls. Girls' venues were split up this year. There was feedback from many teams from the different age groups (U14, U16 and U18) that hopefully the girls get to play back at one venue together again in 2023.
- SJRU vs BJRU Rep fixtures – reintroducing the Inter-state games between SJRU v BJRU gave the Sydney Girls U14 & U16 teams the opportunity to fly to Brisbane and successfully winning their matches against the Brisbane Girls teams. Excellent work to our GM for restoring these interstate games.
- SJRU Girls Tri-Series – It was always a concern that our younger Girls age groups missed out during the May-June months when the Girls XV a side competition ran in preparation for State Champs XV in June. A great initiative to run a Tri-Series for the U11 and U13 girls modelling the 'Dufficy Cup' format meant the girls got a chance to play 10/12 a side in gala event format. Thank you, Ben, for introducing this event for our younger girls.
- Spring 7s – Results from a Survey and feedback from the Girls/Parents meant trialling and moving Spring 7s to Sunday, playing a new Gala format played every fortnight (rather than weekly). This has been received positively giving players more games (up to 4 games with Finals) and travelling worthwhile for families.

DEVELOPMENT

Marcus Stock, Director

2022 has been a challenging year mainly due to the Increased rain from La Nina and the Indian Ocean Dipole, the increased rain created some unique challenges as the competition group relied heavily on technology to enable redraws to be done as quickly as possible.

We continue to review and manage the SJRU cyber security and “live” policies across all the technology aspects we use. We strongly encourage clubs and districts to implement a regular review of the configurations and settings across the various technologies in use at clubs. We have seen a dramatic increase in spam, fishing, and malicious activities this year.

Microsoft have re- confirmed their commitment that each SJRU Club & District can apply online for the Microsoft Not For Profit (NFP) offer, it's a simple 3 step process that will need each club to submit a copy of its constitution & ATO NFP status. Once the club eligibility is confirmed clubs & districts can migrate to the Microsoft Office 365, Teams and Azure hosting and save costs on email, website, and online meetings.

SJRU have now been using the Not for Profit (NFP) offer from Microsoft. This has allowed us to continue to save approximately \$2000 per year by moving to Microsoft Not for Profit Offerings.

Under the Microsoft NFP program and each club & district can receive the following

- Licenses
 - Microsoft 365 Business Basic – 25 users
 - Microsoft 365 Business Premium - 10 users
 - Microsoft 365 Teams and Audio Conferencing - 25 licenses
 - Microsoft Power Automate Free – 10,000 users
 - Office 365 – 25 users
 - SharePoint – 25 users
- Microsoft Azure Hosting
 - The Azure hosting allows club to have apx AU\$400 per month of web site hosting this can range from a simple WordPress website through to creating an on-line gear shop.
- Online Administration
 - Included in the Microsoft NFP office is the ability for clubs to migrate their Domain name for example www.sjru.com.au to the Office 365 management portal. This will allow clubs to have their club's website & email addresses hosted free of charge and have both club and user OneDrive storage.
- Setup guides and Training
 - Once a club has been accepted to the NFP program the NFP portal has links to all the resources included in the program including

online step by step guides to the resources and licenses you have been granted.

- There are several useful online products and admin training courses for each product

We successfully migrated the iCompMan to the SJRU virtual environment to allow the SJRU competition managers get the Winter XV's draws out on schedule despite La Nina effects

Our plans for 2023 are to build our technology foundations to bring online information stores and further streamline the numerous forms in use today, as well as to enhance the SJRU website, to have links to online forms and downloads of the match day guides etc.

The SJRU development working group will work with NSW Rugby on linking to the "Club in a Box" program. SJRU will continue to work with Rugby AU to ensure that our Clubs and Districts, get the best choice of web site options from Microsoft NFP Azure, SharePoint or Rugby Explorer.



REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

2022, well after missing 2019-2021 season for “Representatives” we managed to complete a full season of our program across boys and girls through U14’s to U18’s, despite mother nature’s best endeavours to create obstacles.

2022 started well with appointments of coaching staff and selectors, from a broader spectrum of candidates then was seen in previous seasons.

U18’s Boys started our season with open selection trials held at Terrey Hills, 160 applicants registered their interest and 130 participated on the day playing across 8 teams. Variance of registration and players was result of Saturday injuries and morning of withdrawals. A squad of 35 players selected and coached by Murray Hooper and his team.

State Cup came and went with Sydney “Red & Blue” squads being selected across

Sydney Regional were hosted at Grantham Reserve curtesy of Blacktown Scorpion volunteers, a huge thank you to them for their tireless efforts over the weekend.

Unfortunately, we were only able to play day 1 as day was a "wash out" and called off.



Opportunities for training were few and far between as “wet weather closure”, “cold flu” and occasional “COVID” prevented session being completed.

City vs Country hosted by Bathurst Bulldogs was a fantastic day with quality performances across teams throughout the day. Ultimately City came out with 4 wins and 3 losses:

Our teams will depart Sunday Monday and arrive in Brisbane for their fixture and return that evening. A Huge thank you for Ben Gregory who has diligently been cultivating the return of these matches now for several years.

In terms of 2022 summary, we've conducted our review and in line with previously concepts we've been discussing with Gen Blue Developments team. In 2023 we will endeavour to align our Sydney Coaching staff with Gen Blue's application process and incorporate Ben's Coaching academy applicants. This will enable us to develop a coaching pathway, which will enable coaches to come through SJRU and NSWJRU ranks before progressing to Gen Blue, Subbies and Shute Shield programs.

In terms of 2023 SJRU teams they will all remain as they are except the Under 15's Boys will now align with the other ages groups in selecting just a red and blue squad.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

Happily, we started the season confident that 'Lockdowns' were behind us, and then came the rain! However, all in all it has felt like a 'normal' season compared to the interrupted 2020 and 2021 seasons!

The projects team started the year by establishing a 'Support' team of Admin Gurus to assist club registrars and volunteers with anything from dispensations, Xplorer queries, compliance, Code of Conduct, and game day rules.

We set up an email support@sjru.rugby and clubs quickly took advantage of this valuable resource.

Our next project involved one of our smaller clubs that was facing a challenge after a change in committee, the club found itself with no committee and very few volunteers. Our team met with some of the key stakeholders including families, neighbouring clubs, and the district to establish a 'working group' to support this club staying on its feet and becoming viable for 2022 and beyond. I have nothing but praise and respect for the parents from this club that put up their hands and worked tirelessly to build player memberships and morale within the club, we are now seeing this club grow & flourish under its new leadership team. Personally, for myself this was one of my highlights in the Projects role, I am grateful to this small club & its community for allowing me to work alongside them this season. Thanks, must also go to The Two Blues District President for his support, neighbouring Two Blues village clubs that provided assistance and from the SJRU, General Manager Ben Gregory, Competition Manager, John Glen, Director of Finance Sean Goonan, Secretary Louise Reid and Western Zone Director, Bernard Tuaimau.

This support is invaluable to clubs who find themselves in similar situations, our working group is committed to ensuring our affiliated clubs remain strong and viable.

Compliance – With the updating of the Code of Conduct policy and the Safeguarding children guide, we continue to work with clubs and the Office of children's guardian to ensure compliance around these important matters. The SJRU will provide all Club administrators with a checklist and guide for season 2023 around working with children and compliance, this should make it easy for club registrars to maintain correct record keeping.

Early in the 2023 season we will host a webinar for Club administrators as well as covering off more on compliance at the All Clubs and Zone meetings.



Finance Director Report

Sean Goonan, Director

I am pleased to report that, after the first uninterrupted season in a few years, the Association had a positive financial result, that being a profit of \$26,709. It is a better result than 2021, the key year on year movements are:

- **Sponsorship income** made a comeback in 2022 thanks to some generous support from Maqro, Elmo, Harvey Norman, Riviana Foods and BondIQ. If you have the opportunity, please support these sponsors.
- **Representative costs** were a net positive \$32,148 due to the investment in representative kit from 2021
- **Government Covid Support** – 2021 included \$20,000 of Covid grants whereas 2022 did not.
- **Net Competition costs** across 7s and 15s were higher by \$61,643. There was some creep of bills from 2021 flowing into 2022 (game balls and referee costs for 7s \$20k) however the main elements of the cost increase are for wages for our support teams. Of the higher wage's costs incurred, \$27,000 won't be incurred again in 2023.
- **Board & Meeting expenses** were higher in 2022 due to some costs for room hire and functions creeping in from 2021.
- **Software costs** – SJRU purchased a licence for the iCompman software to assist in the draw creation for the various competitions we run.

During the year SJRU supported the re-build of the Blacktown Scorpions. From a financial perspective, this involved SJRU paying a bill with the Blacktown Council for ground hire and lights from previous years. This debt has been repaid to SJRU in full.

As for the balance sheet, the Association's net assets and liquidity remain very strong. Our cash at bank is \$395,854, \$12,130 ahead of last year's position. Other than Cash, the main balance sheet movement is for sundry debtors. NSWJRU owe SJRU \$23,458 for fees collected for the recent representative games in Brisbane, these fees will be paid to SJRU in the near future.

The Association is in a strong liquidity position and can pay all its liabilities as and when they fall due.

I would like to convey my personal thanks to Mark Green and his team at NSWJRU who have been extremely responsive, patient, and supportive to me in this role. Thank you.
